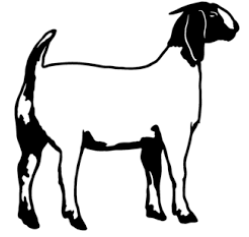
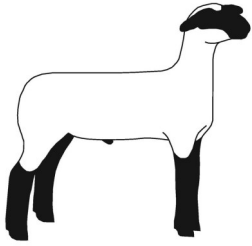
Fresno Fair Grounds

Entries due: Monday, August 19th

Weigh-in & Preparation: 8:00 AM

Sheep Show begins at 9:00 AM

Goat Show begins at 9:30 AM



Entry fees: \$4/animal– includes showmanship and market class. Entries are due by August 19th via on-line entry. Late entries will be charged a \$5 late fee per animal. All fees are payable the day of the show.

Animal Eligibility: All animals shown at the 4-H Sheep & Goat Show must also be entered and shown in a **market** class at the Caruthers and/or Fresno Fairs. Each exhibitor may enter and show up to 2 animals per species. *Exception– members that are now old enough for a livestock project but do not qualify by age to show at the Fresno Fair.*

Grooming: This is a “Dry Show” meaning all animals must be washed and groomed before they arrive.

Bring: shovels, rakes, and pitchforks. All areas must be cleaned prior to leaving.

Reminder: The use of generators is not permitted on the Fair Grounds.

County Record Book Judging

Saturday, August 3, 2024

Start time- 8:00 AM sharp!



The classrooms utilized for Record Book Judging are located in rear of campus in the N/W corner. **One volunteer is required for every 5 books submitted.** Volunteers must be available from 8:00 AM until a minimum of noon. Completion time is based upon the number of books submitted, usually by 2:00 PM. Please consider taking the 30-minute online course for County Record Book Evaluation Orientation. This course is for adult volunteers and Senior Members who evaluate Record Books at county level. *The course provides an overview of the following:*

- Evaluation Rubric
- Scoring Techniques
- How to give constructive feedback

After you complete the course, you will receive an electronic badge and certificate to acknowledge your dedication to helping youth develop their skills in record-keeping.

Please inform the county office of number of books anticipated at Record Book Judging. This includes all Officer Books and individual books wishing to participate in competition. YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS– ARE YOU CERTIFIED?

Required to participate in the BIG Fresno Fair & The Caruthers Fair

YOUTH FOR THE QUALITY CARE OF ANIMALS– ARE YOU CERTIFIED? Required to participate in the BIG Fresno Fair & The Caruthers Fair All youth livestock program participants are required to obtain annual certification from the Youth for the Quality Care of Animals (YQCA) program. This requirement is mandated by the California Department of Food & Agriculture (CDFA) and the Division of Fairs & Expositions (F&E). Certification can be obtained through online training or at an approved instructor led training. The YQCA certification is good for one year and only needs to be completed once annually regardless of the number of species shown. Those not certified through this youth education certification program on the issues of animal welfare, food safety and character education are not eligible to participate at any California fair. The Big Fresno Fair and the Caruthers Fair requires the YQCA certification to be completed at time of project entry as your certification number will be required as part of the online entry process.

ONLINE VS. INSTRUCTOR LED YQCA TRAINING For both online and instructor-led training, you are required to register in advance on the <https://yqcaprogram.org/> website. Online training costs \$12 per exhibitor and may be completed at anytime prior to entry deadline.
