
4-H YEAR ENDS

June 30, 2011 ends the 2010-2011 year. Your club must do the following to finish the year:

- **1.** Have members update and finish record books.
- 2. Judge record books at community club level.
- 3. Get record books and officer books prepared for County Record Book Judging due Friday, July 22nd.
- 4. Prepare for community club year end completion.
 - a. Club By-Laws*
 - b. Financial Summary Statement*
 - c. Secretary's Book*
 - d. Treasurer's Book*
 - e. Goals
- 5. Enter the above items to receive your charter seal for the 2010-2011 year.

You will need to submit these items to Melanie Curtis no later than **Monday, August 1, 2011.** (Officer Books must be entered by **Friday, July 22nd** for those officers wishing to compete for an Officer's Medal.) Information from these documents needs to be submitted to the state 4-H office or your club will no longer be a chartered 4-H club and your members will not be able to participate in the Fresno Fair.

COUNTY RECORD BOOK JUDGING





Record books are to be arranged in the following order:

- 1. Current Personal Development Report (PDR).
- 2. 4-H Story Six pages max., double spaced on one side of paper only. May be typed or hand-written. For computer generated stories, a standard font in 12 point is preferred.
- 3. All Project Reports are for current year. Advanced forms and leadership forms should immediately follow the Project Report for that project.
- 4. Up to five pages (one side only) of pictures, two pages of flyers and/or correspondence, and two pages of news clippings. Should show growth in project(s) and should be directly related to 4-H work.

Do not include previous P.D.R.'s, 4-H Stories, or photos.

Primary members are not eligible for record book competition.

Primary years DO NOT count towards P.D.R. credits and may not be counted for "Years in 4-H" or "Years in Project."

The old "Information Sheet" is no longer necessary.

Please see 4-H office or our website (http://ucanr.org/4-Hforms) for most up-to-date information and forms.

Record Books are due Friday, July 22th.

Judging will take place **Saturday**, **July 23th**, beginning at 9 a.m. Adult judges are needed. Each club must provide one judge for every five books submitted. Clubs may "share" judges. Lunch will be a potluck.

PLEASE DO NOT SIGN CONTRACTS OR AGREEMENTS!

Please do not sign any contract, facility use form, or other agreements on behalf of your 4-H Club or the 4-H Program. Most of these documents contain liability statements which can make you personally liable if there is any accident or injury. Even parade entries contain liability statements. Send these documents to the 4-H Office, and we will be more than happy to have them processed and signed for your club. In order for the University to honor the agreement, it must be approved by our office and signed by our County Director. Protect yourself and the 4-H Program by making sure these agreements are completed and signed correctly.
