#### PLEASE DO NOT SIGN CONTRACTS OR AGREEMENTS!



Please do not sign any contract, facility use form, or other agreements on behalf of your 4-H Club or the 4-H Program. Most of these documents contain liability statements which can make you personally liable if there is any accident or injury. Even parade entries can contain liability statements. Send these documents to the 4-H Office, and we will be more than happy to have them processed and signed for your club. In order for the University to honor the agreement, it must be approved by our office and signed by our County Director. Protect yourself and the 4-H Program by making sure these agreements are completed and signed correctly.

#### REMINDER: Enrollment Requirements for Active Participation

Any youth actively participating at a 4-H meeting or event MUST BE ENROLLED IN THE 4HONLINE system. We welcome visitors to attend and observe as many times as needed to make well informed decisions on their club and project choices. We CANNOT have active, hands-on participation on any level with out having completed your enrollment and being activated as a 4-H member. A recent county event brought new awareness to this issue with participation of non-members.

#### **BEST PRACTICE FOR 4-H OFFICE VISITS**

# Fresno Grizzlies Farm Grown Scholarships Guidelines and Application

Farm Grown promotes the agricultural heritage and philanthropic vitality of the Central San Joaquin Valley through the building of meaningful partnerships in support of education, agriculture, healthy living, and baseball. Through this initiative, the Fresno Grizzlies are pleased to provide up to \$10,000 in scholarships annually to outstanding local FFA and 4-H students pursuing a degree in an agricultural-related field.

#### Applicants wishing to apply for consideration must:

- Be a graduating high-school senior residing within one of the following counties:
   Fresno, Tulare, Kings, Merced, Madera, Mariposa, or Kern
- Have at least a 2.80 cumulative grade point average
- Be enrolled as a full-time student in an accredited two-year or four-year college or university
- Major and study in an agricultural field
- o Be an active member of FFA or 4-H within the San Joaquin and Central Regions
- o Not have received financial assistance from the Fresno Grizzlies within the last 24 months

#### How to apply:

- Complete the Scholarship Application in full
- Submit one (1) letter of recommendation from an agriculture leader and one (1)
   recommendation letter from a teacher/4-H leader or other school official (letters may not be from family members). Mail letters by March 1st to: Attn: Farm Grown Scholarship

- Provide an official cumulative High School transcript

April 13 – 16, 2020 Winton, CA

The 4-H Western Heritage Project combines a comprehensive study of the Old West with the shooting sports discipline of western action shooting. The purpose of this project is to provide an avenue for 4-H members and adult leaders to experience the lifestyles and cultures of the Old West from the period of around 1860- 1900 through a living history approach to learning while instilling the concepts of gun safety and personal responsibility. Members dress in Old West clothing, shoot replica firearms of the frontier period, and expand their knowledge of U.S. history.

A National 4-H Western Heritage Workshop will be held in Winton, (Merced County) California in the spring of 2020. The training will start on Monday, April 13<sup>th</sup> at 6:30 p.m. and conclude Thursday, April 16<sup>th</sup> at 7:00 p.m. at the River Oaks Firearms Training Center <a href="https://safetyfirstshooting.net/">https://safetyfirstshooting.net/</a>. 
