Coronavirus Update on 4-H Activities

IN PERSON MEETINGS – The time is near for resuming 4-H small group "in person" meetings. The County Director will be giving us the green light, POSSIBLY by June 15th. All leaders will be notified of the exact date. Two mandatory training documents must be reviewed prior to holding meetings. Awareness of Coronavirus Disease and Mitigation Standards Summary COVID-19 Stage2 Leaders are to read, print (if possible or office may print for you), display at meetings, and adhere at all times to detailed guidelines and protocol to maintain the safety and wellbeing of both 4-H youth and adults. Leaders are Required to complete a brief survey as verification of training completion. Training must be documented by having the volunteer sign a training record, or completing the following online survey. http://ucanr.edu/survey/survey.cfm? surveynumber=30392 Leaders MAY NOT HOLD MEETINGS until survey verification is recorded at County Office.

Follow these simply meeting guideline Requirements:

- 1) If feeling ill, running a temperature, or recently exposed to COVID-19, STAY HOME!
- 2) No more than 8 youth & 2 adults at any individual meeting (total of 10 currently until further notice).
- 3) Must maintain six feet distance between people at all times (meet outdoors when possible)
- 4) Wear face coverings (cloth, paper, of bandanas, etc.) when six feet separation cannot be maintained.
- 5) Maintain sanitary practices frequently clean and disinfect workspaces and equipment, wash hands often and use hand sanitizer.

RECORD BOOKS ARE DUE AUGUST 3, 2020

County & Officer Books to be turned in to 4-H Office



All 4-H members must submit a record book or at least an APR (Annual Project Report) at the end of the year in order to receive their year pin and stripe and to participate in the Caruthers & Fresno County Fairs.

WAYS TO SUBMIT BOOKS Drop off hard copies of Record Books to your Club Leasers via drop box. They may bring to the 4-H Office & utilize a drop box located outside. Scanning & emailing are acceptable options. Email entire file to tlnewton@ucanr.edu. **Precautions are in place to let books sit for CDC recommended amount of time before being touched by others.**

A NOTE ON SIGNATURES

Member emails the forms to the leader.

- The leader can sign it electronically OR
- The leader can print it out, sign it with a pen, scan it, and send it back OR
- Regular wet signatures OR
- The leader can send an email back to the member saying they approve the document.

The member then attaches the documentation to the Record Book as verification.

Members will not be penalized for using an alternate method to get leader signature approvals.





Expression Pages and Collection of Work are eliminated this year. (You may complete them but they will not be part of the evaluation)

You will complete a PDR, APR, My 4-H Story, + LDR for Intermediate & Seniors, + Resume for Seniors

No change to the requirements to receive a Star Rank

CALIFORNIA FREE OF VIRULENT NEWCASTLE DISEASE

SACRAMENTO, June 1, 2020 – The California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) and the U.S. Department of Agriculture (USDA) have announced an end to the Virulent Newcastle Disease (VND) quarantine in Southern California. Extensive testing of the regulated area has been completed, with no additional detections of the disease. This allows poultry to again move freely within California.




VND was first detected in May of 2018 in Los Angeles County. By December 2018 the virus had spread extensively in backyard poultry in the LA Basin and also infected commercial flocks. After prolonged disease control efforts, the last confirmed positive case was detected in February, 2020. Testing has continued throughout the area since that time to gain assurance that the disease was eradicated.

All backyard poultry owners and commercial operations are encouraged to practice biosecurity measures to help prevent the introduction of disease when people enter or depart the premises, to routinely check birds for signs of illness, and to report any incidence of suspected VND or other bird diseases. New for 2020- ONE MARKET ANIMAL ENTRY per exhibitor. Members and their families are advised to **consider the following in making decisions to purchase market animals.**

- A) Invest only amounts that you can afford to lose, shows and auctions could still be cancelled
- B) Prepare to secure buyers as support we've had in past likely will not be an option this year
- C) Be prepared to keep your animal for private treaty sale or personal consumption.

After considering this information, members should proceed as their families deem appropriate.

We continue to be hopeful for our fall fairs.


