Coronavirus Update on 4-H Activities

IN PERSON MEETINGS – Due to an updated UC ANR mandate, ALL INDOOR meetings are prohibited. Until Fresno County is no longer on the Monitoring List meetings are restricted to being held outdoors. The small group allowance continues to be 8 youth and 2 adults per meeting space. When feasible keep members of same households together. Two mandatory training documents must be reviewed by Project/Club Leaders prior to holding meetings. Awareness of Coronavirus Disease and Mitigation Standards Summary COVID-19 Stage2 Leaders are to read, print (if possible or office may print for you), display at meetings, and adhere at all times to detailed guidelines and protocol to maintain the safety and wellbeing of both 4-H youth and adults. Leaders are Required to complete a brief survey as verification of training completion. Training must be documented by having the volunteer sign a training record, or completing the following online survey. http://ucanr.edu/survey/survey.cfm?

Follow these simply meeting guideline Requirements:

- 1) If feeling ill, running a temperature, or recently exposed to COVID-19, STAY HOME!
- 2) No more than 8 youth & 2 adults at any individual meeting (total of 10 currently until further notice).
- 3) Must maintain six feet distance between people at all times (outdoor only meetings)
- 4) Wear face coverings (cloth, paper, of bandanas, etc.) when six feet separation cannot be maintained.
- 5) Maintain sanitary practices frequently clean and disinfect workspaces and equipment, wash hands often and use hand sanitizer.

GIRLS HEALTH PROJECT – LONE STAR 4-H – OPEN TO ALL CLUBS

Periods. We're talking about periods! Join us virtually at your art table & in your kitchen as we explore a girl's monthly cycle from a new perspective.

While often shrouded in a cloud of mystery & even shame, we'll be going "behind the scenes" to look at this 5th vital sign. Yup, vital sign! Back in 2015 the ACOG (American College of Obstetricians & Gynecologists) decreed that a girl's cycle is her 5th vital sign & indicator of health.

In this project we'll spend some time exploring the different phases of a cycle & how it plays into a girl's everyday health in the way she feels, eats, exercises, & thinks. These incredible hormones really do impact so many aspects of our lives!

This program is not geared towards sex education but only body literacy as it pertains to female hormones & this 5th vital sign. There's a lot of taboo around this topic & it can be uncomfortable for some. But we're going to take that head on & address it together with sensitivity because this information is pertinent to healthy living.

We'll have 5 virtual meetings that will include art-making & time in the kitchen connected to our topic. The kitchen portion will be optional as we prepare & enjoy foods that support different cycle phases. Since this is all virtual, you'll be provided with a shopping list well in advance.

There is no age requirement for this class because the information is pertinent to girls whether they have started cycling or not, though younger girls will likely need assistance in the kitchen. Parents are always welcome to attend & participate in our meetings.

Project meetings will take place on Sunday afternoons from 2-3:30 on the following dates: October 18, November 15, January 24, February 21, & March 21.



California 4-H Shooting Sports and Merced County 4-H are co-hosting a Shooting Sports - Skills Development Day for you - the Adult Leader!

Here is the opportunity to be better prepared to lead your project! This will be a challenging year for California 4H Shooting Sports, let's make it the best we can. Come out and let's shake the rust off!

This is your chance to further develop your adult leader skills.
