Coronavirus Update on 4-H Activities

IN PERSON MEETINGS – We have been approved for resuming 4-H small group “in person” meetings limited to **OUTDOORS ONLY**. All leaders must have completed the two mandatory training documents prior to holding meetings.

Leaders are to read, print (if possible or office may print for you), display at meetings, and adhere at all times to detailed guidelines and protocol to maintain the safety & wellbeing of both 4-H youth and adults. Leaders are Required to complete a brief survey as verification of training completion.

Training must be documented by having the volunteer sign a training record, or completing the following online survey.

Follow these simply meeting guideline Requirements:

- 1) *If feeling ill, running a temperature, or recently exposed to COVID-19, **STAY HOME!***
- 2) *No more than 8 youth & 2 adults at any individual meeting (total of 10 currently until further notice).*
- 3) *Must maintain six feet distance between people at all times (meet outdoors when possible).*
- 4) *Wear face coverings (cloth, paper, of bandanas, etc) when six feet separation cannot be maintained.*
- 5) *Maintain sanitary practices – frequently clean and disinfect workspaces and equipment, wash hands often and use hand sanitizer.*

4-H encourages every member to develop and polish their public speaking skills by participating in County Presentation Day. There are many ways to participate in Presentation Day. Participants may give a traditional demonstration or illustrated talk where they show "how-to-do" something using visual aids or posters or a prepared speech or interpretive reading or an impromptu speech etc. The ways to participate are explained in the California 4-H Presentation Day Manual. Take time to read about the various ways to participate in Presentation Day, and then research your topic. Find an interpretive reading you enjoy or a favorite recipe you can use to develop into a presentation. Prepare your script, make your posters, or gather your props, if your category requires such items. Spend time practicing your presentation. Q: What is 4-H?

A: The 4-H Youth Development Program is an informal educational opportunity where youth, ages 5-19, learn by doing from skilled adult volunteers in project areas like science, health, agriculture, & citizenship. To learn more, please visit ucanr.edu/sites/4-H-Fresno.

Q: What is HOPE Sanger?

A: HOPE Sanger is a multi-denominational faith based non-profit community 501c3 organization that was originally established to provide food and other necessities to the homeless and needy families of Sanger, CA, but due to the increased homeless population has since expanded to include a temporary transitional living center. HOPE Sanger took management of a 17 room motel, which was considered a crime and drug hotspot, and converted it to a valuable community resource. Hope Sanger exists through generous public donations and fundraising which has allowed the agency to provide assistance to an estimated 10,000 people yearly. Since HOPE Sanger's inception in 2010, it is the only agency in the Sanger/Del Rey area that provides a combination of temporary living assistance, social services, and food/meal distribution, to anyone experiencing a crisis. Project Meeting Tips & Ideas

During this time, it may be difficult to meet the 6-hour requirement to complete projects. Below are ideas/tips to assist in meeting the minimum.

- Zoom meetings testing knowledge or sharing Project activities completed at home (Pygmy Goat Project - Jeopardy game testing knowledge)
- Assign activities project members can complete at home and submit completed work back to Project Leader (Baking Project – baking cookies, photography – share photos, etc.)
- Poster of livestock breeds/knowledge (Rabbit Project - sharing varieties of Rabbit breeds)
- Sharing videos of project aspects (Horse project - confirmation of a horse)

Remember -

Annual Project Reports are required to participate in livestock projects at local Fairs.

4-H County Emerald Star

What is an Emerald Star?



Fresno County offers 4-H'ers the opportunity to earn an Emerald Star. The Emerald Star program is designed for intermediate and senior 4-H members ages 13 and up. The Emerald Star project's purpose includes:

1. Providing an opportunity for 4-H members to develop projects in their community or in 4-H beyond the club level.
2. Improving, creating, and expanding 4-H programs.

Helping individual 4-H members grow and improve in the areas of organization, leadership, and project planning.

This program is designed to help youth learn about project planning, organization, and presentation.

Typically, youth develop an action plan for some type of multi-county event. They then organize and facilitate this event. After completion and presentation of their project, they are awarded with the Emerald Star ranking. Those members wishing to apply for the "Homer Williams Scholarship" must have completed an Emerald Star Project. - Online subscriptions (e.g., Amazon Prime, Netflix, Disney+, Hulu, Spotify, Audible, games, news)
- Online monthly bill payments to other merchants (e.g., cell phone, home wireless)
- Ad hoc online purchases (e.g., groceries, pet supplies, clothing, gifts)
- Local shopping (e.g., groceries, coffee shop, craft shops, etc.)
- AND - 4-H projects and animal care, of course

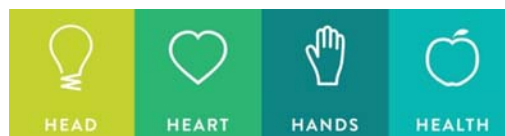
Later this month, the 4-H Card mobile app will increase convenience *and allow you to see your personal impact*. It will also connect to smaller credit unions or community banks, a big plus.

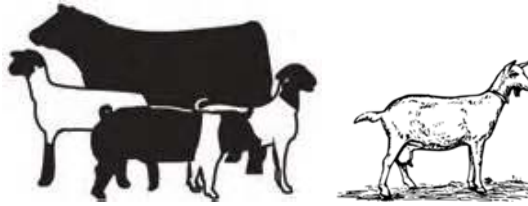
