Each summer 4-H members that are at least 9 years old and up to having just finished 8th grade are eligible to attend Fresno County overnight 4-H Camp at beautiful Camp Keola on Huntington Lake. The Keola camp staff provide delicious meals as well as lifeguards for the waterfront.

Our own high school age 4-H members act as Junior Counselors (JCs) and plan camp activities as well as act as cabin counselors. Adult 4-H leaders volunteer to chaperone at camp. Another 4-H volunteer acts as camp nurse.

If you haven't been before, hope you make it next vear!!!



What's the Difference Between Danish & American Systems of Judging?

The *Danish System* of Judging is based upon established standards of quality for each type of product. In this system each exhibit is judged according to how well it meets that standard rather than how it compares with other exhibits. Blue-Excellent-A; Red-Good-B; White-Fair/Average-C One advantage of the Danish system is that everyone whose work fulfills at least the minimum qualification can receive a ribbon of recognition. Theoretically, if all entries are judged to be excellent, all would receive blue ribbons. If all entries were judged to be poor, all would receive white ribbons or no ribbons at all. In Danish, ribbons signify levels of achievement, not placing. The Danish System is used at the 4-H Fair with Still Exhibits, Presentation Day, etc.

In the *American System*, each exhibit is judged not only on its own merit, but in comparison to other exhibits in the class. Awards given may be 1st place through 10th place, depending on the number of exhibits in the class. No awards are normally given past 10th place. An example of where the American System is used is in Livestock Showmanship classes.


