Special thanks to "The Alli-V" for hosting the evening and to the Sanger Masonic Lodge for sponsoring the event.





What is a Judging Contest?

A judging class consists of four items. The 4-H'er is asked to evaluate and rank the class in order from best to worst. Points are given on how close the participant comes to matching the placing an expert gives the class.

Junior, Intermediate and Senior 4-H participants will also be given the opportunity to give oral reasons. Oral reasons enable the participant to explain to a judge why they placed the class the way they did. Points are given for how convincing the reasons are. Even if the class wasn't placed correctly, if good reasons are given, the points will reflect that.

How to Give Reasons:

When you explain your choices in a judging contest, you are "giving reasons". Before you can give your reasons, you need to have a clear picture of the class in your mind. After judging the class, be sure to make some notes. Giving reasons will be easier after you have studied your notes. Step up to the judge and explain your reasons using the following example:

Opening Statement: I placed this class of	4-1-2-3.	
Explanation: In my top pair, I place 4 over 1 because: For my middle pair, I place 1 over 2 because: In my bottom pair, I place 2 over 3 because:		
Closing Statement: For these reasons, I placed this class of	4-1-2-3. Thank you.

Please pre-register by January 5th (no recipes are required to pre-register.) This enables the planning committee to better prepare for the number of entries that will be arriving.

Late entries will **NOT** be accepted after January 7th at 12 noon the day of the event.

Categories include:

Category 1 - Dairy Foods - One of the principle ingredients must be a dairy product such as butter, milk, cheese, sour cream, yogurt, etc. No substitutes. Acceptable entries include: Appetizers/ cheese balls, cookies, cakes, desserts, breads.

Category 2 - Traditional - **Must** include information about the original tradition of the recipe and how it relates to your family. Acceptable entries include: breads, cookies, cakes, desserts.

Category 3 - Candies - Caramels/taffies, chew candies, creams, fudges, divinity dipped candies, fruit and nut candies or brittles, candied apples, stuffed dates, hard candies, lollipops, lemon drops, gum drops, popcorn balls, etc.

Category 4 - Healthier Goodies - Main ingredient(s) must be nutritious i.e., whole wheat grains, bran, nuts, fruit, vegetables. Acceptable entries include: Appetizers, snacks, green leafy salads and fruit salads.

Category 5 - Trix-From-a-Mix – Entry must include ADDITIONAL ingredients SEPARATE from the box mix instructions. Acceptable entries include: Appetizers & snacks (no meat items), cookies, breads, desserts, cakes.

Category 6 – Holiday Decorations – Must be designed and assembled by the 4-H member. Entries may include: Centerpieces, Place Settings (include menu, no food: Suggest using a photo for quick assembly), Gift baskets (filled and decorated), Creative Holiday Craft (hand crafted holiday decorations, ornaments, jewelry, etc.)

Category 7 - For 2023 – Charcuterie Board – size limited to 12 inch X 12 inch area. Acceptable entries include: crackers, jams. Breads, pickles, humus, spreadable cheese, processed meats, block cheese, lettuce, nuts, waffles (This category changes every year.)

Each entry space for all categories is limited to: 12 inch X 12 inch area per entry.




