4-H Summer Camp

June 20-June 24th

Each summer 4-H members that are at least 9 years old through 8th grade graduates are eligible to attend Fresno County overnight 4-H Camp at beautiful Camp Keola on Huntington Lake. The camp session this year runs from Tuesday morning June 20th through Saturday June 24th at 11 am. The Keola camp staff provide delicious meals for us as well as lifeguards for the waterfront.

Our own high school age 4-H members act as Junior Counselors and plan camp activities as well as act as cabin counselors. Adult 4-H leaders volunteer to chaperone at camp. Another 4-H volunteer acts as camp nurse.

Camp Keola provides a full range of camp fun. The waterfront allows for swimming, kayaking, canoeing, paddle boating as well as fishing. The JCs plan sports activities, crafts, hiking, evening activities, dining hall fun and campfire activities. Many campers choose to spend one night sleeping under the stars and the bravest participate in the polar bear plunge.

The cost for camp is \$325. Partial camp scholarships are available for first time campers and for families sending multiple children to camp. You must fill out the scholarship application to qualify. Applications are on a first come first serve basis if camp fills up. **The camper application, scholarship application and adult volunteer application will be available on the website later in April.**

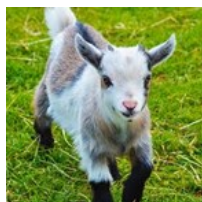

Club Activity Booths:

All clubs are expected to provide an activity booth at the 4-H Fair. The booth volunteers should engage both fair participants and fair visitors in either games, make-it-take-it, community service, agriculture, or other fun activities. You can also promote your club at the same time. The activity booths should be set up no later than 10:00 AM and should have enough supplies to run until 1:00 PM. Please contact Marcie West from Blossom Trail 4-H (559-575-3274) no later than **May 6, 2023** to let her know what activity your club is planning for the fair. This will allow us to provide a variety of activities and avoid duplication.

4-H Fair Participants:

It's time to start thinking about what you want to enter in the fair. In still exhibits you can enter anything you've made this year for a 4-H project you are enrolled in. Examples include baking, sewing, arts and crafts, rocketry and many more. There are additional fun categories that anyone can enter. These include Decorated Clothing (do you like to bling things?), Decorated Cake (Yum!), Table Setting, and a Poster Contest. Check them out on the 4-H fair website. Still exhibit entries are turned in with your entry by **8:30 AM** the day of the fair. You must fill out the entry form ahead of time. It's on the website.

Animal related entries include the Dog Show, Poultry, Cavy and Rabbit shows, as well as the Pygmy Goat Show and a BEEF Showmanship Clinic. *There is also a costume contest for rabbits, chickens and goats.* Animal and showmanship entries are due at the 4-H office by **Friday, May 5.**

The 4-H fair handbook will be available soon on the website. Be sure to use the new entry forms, not any from previous years. Entry forms also require the signature of your project leader or CCL.

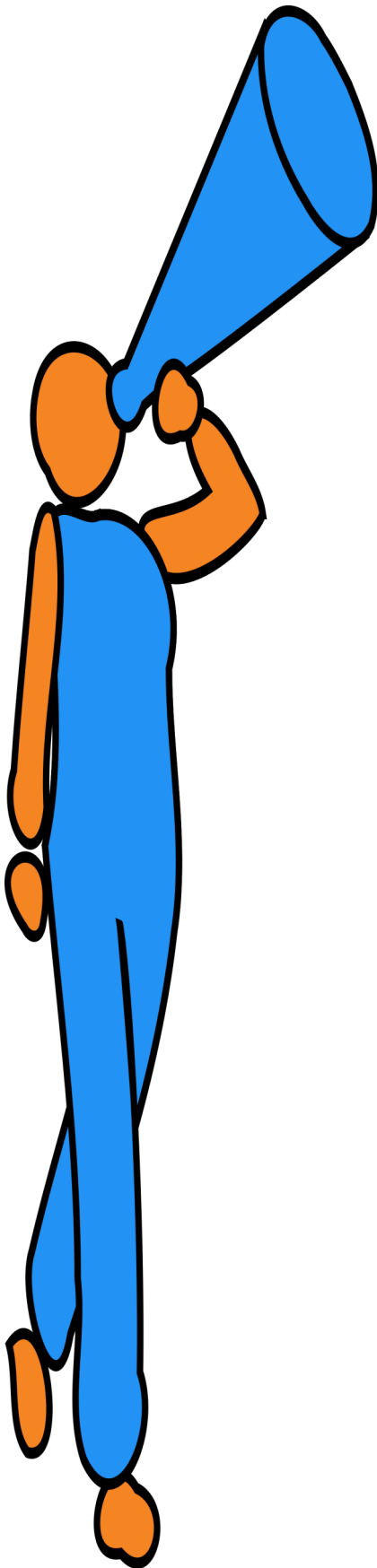
BEE TOUR, BY JOSE PATINO
