Each summer 4-H members that are at least 9 years old through 8th grade graduates are eligible to attend Fresno County overnight 4-H Camp at beautiful Camp Keola on Huntington Lake. The camp session this year runs from Tuesday morning June 20th through Saturday June 24th at 11 am. The Keola camp staff provide delicious meals for us as well as lifeguards for the waterfront.

Our own high school age 4-H members act as Junior Counselors and plan camp activities as well as act as cabin counselors. Adult 4-H leaders volunteer to chaperone at camp. Another qualified 4-H volunteer acts as camp nurse.

Registration is open! The camp holds 70 campers— so be sure to register as soon as possible! The cost is \$325/camper and an optional camp t-shirt is \$10. Scholarship assistance is available through Tractor Supply Clover Drive Funds.

Camp Keola provides a full range of camp fun. The waterfront allows for swimming, kayaking, canoeing, paddle boating as well as fishing. The JCs plan sports activities, crafts, hiking, evening activities, dining hall fun and campfire activities. Many campers choose to spend one night sleeping under the stars and the bravest participate in the polar bear plunge.

Here is a little update on the 2023 DG Colt Challenge. We had 40 youth in 4-H and FFA enroll in the program from 18 counties all over California. This year, weanlings through two-year old wild horses were available to participants from the 2022 Devil's Garden Wild Horse gather. Youth picked up their horses around January 1, 2023. A competition will be held on June 17th at the Junior Livestock Showgrounds (8th and Nagle St.) in Alturas starting at Noon for them to compete for awards in halter, showmanship and obstacle course.

Each April a video challenge is held for youth to show how far they have come with their horses. This was a great activity during Covid but has continued to be a highlight and opportunity to share more about our youth and their horses with partners and interested parties. Videos were evaluated on 4 criteria: Creativity, Horse Behavior, Trainer Ability, and Grooming. The winners this year are below, please enjoy watching their videos.
