Junior Leader Age Requirement Change for Fresno County

At the November Leadership Council Meeting, it was voted to change the age requirement to become a Junior Leader to align with the State 4-H requirement. Beginning immediately, the age requirement to become a Junior Leader is-

Junior leaders (intermediate members): To become a junior leader, members must be at least 11 and no more than 13 years old by December 31st of the program year.

Teen leaders (senior members): To become a teen leader, members must be at least 14 and no more than 19 years old by December 31st of the program year.

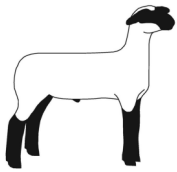
Awards You Can Earn!

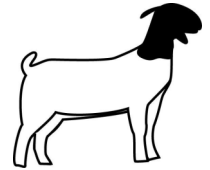

Simone Gabrielle participated in the American Breeders Association Convention in Louisville, Kentucky from October 26-30, 2024. She won Youth Best Opposite of Breed during the convention. Simone is the only 4-H member showing the rare Rhinelander rabbit in Fresno County 4-H. The Rhinelander was developed by Josef Heintz of Grevenbroich, North Rhine-Westphalia, and was first shown in 1902 in Germany. Get a head start on preparing a presentation for Fresno County's 4-H Presentation Day by beginning now! 4-H encourages every member to develop and polish their public speaking skills by participating in County Presentation Day. There are many ways to participate in Presentation Day. Participants may give a traditional demonstration or illustrated talk where they show “how-to-do” something using visual aids or posters or a prepared speech or an interpretive reading or an impromptu speech, etc. The ways to participate are explained in the CA 4-H Presentation Day Manual. Take time to read about the various ways to participate in Presentation Day, and then research your topic. Find an interpretive reading you enjoy or a favorite recipe you can use to develop into a presentation. Prepare your script, make your posters, or gather your props, if your category requires such items. Spend time practicing your presentation. 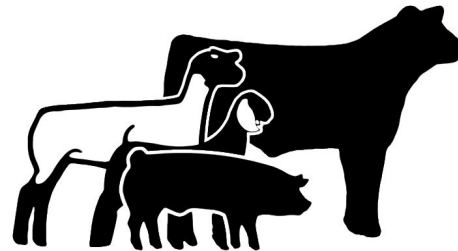
