New Members – please note if your family is "new" to 4-H, you must create a FAMILY PROFILE in 4hOnline at https://ca.4honline.com/. 4hOnline is our online system to sign up members and volunteers in 4-H. Family members are grouped together in one family profile. Only one family profile for all family members, please! If you are under 18, please have a parent or guardian enter the information because you will have to submit medical release forms through the system. Adult Volunteers – Must be 18 years or older. A volunteer cannot simultaneously be a 4-H member. Chaperones must be at least 21 years of age or older. Potential volunteers must submit a 4-H Adult Volunteer Interest Survey, complete the 4-H adult volunteer application process in 4hOnline, complete the required volunteer training in eXtension, submit fee payment to club leader, and complete a live-scan clearance with the Department of Justice. 

Animal Ownership and 4-H Project Supervision Requirements

4-H FFA Grange CDFA Agreement July 1, 2016

Poultry, Rabbit, Feeder and breeding animals—must be <u>owned and supervised</u> for <u>not less than **30** consecutive days</u> and be <u>en</u>rolled in the project for not less than **60** consecutive days.

Market sheep, swine, veal and goats — must be owned and supervised for not less than 60 consecutive days.

Market beef—must be owned and supervised for not less than 120 consecutive days.

Horses—must be <u>owned/leased and supervised</u> for <u>not less than **120** consecutive days</u>. Male foals may be shown by 4-H members, but yearling and older stallions are ineligible for 4-H projects. The age of the horse shall be computed on the basis of a calendar year starting January 1 of the year foaled; it is a weanling during the calendar year in which foaled, and a yearling during the first calendar year following its foaling date, regardless of year foaled.






Backyard Livestock/Poultry Survey

If you have backyard livestock or poultry or are a small-scale producer of livestock or poultry, this survey is for you. This questionnaire asks about the specific practices and perceptions that you apply to your animals' health, husbandry, and antimicrobial use. It is being conducted for research and outreach purposes in order to find better ways to serve people and communities with backyard and small-scale livestock or poultry.

Conducted by the University of California Cooperative Extension and the School of Veterinary Medicine and funded by the California Department of Food and Agriculture, this survey will take about 20 minutes to complete. Provided information will be kept strictly confidential. We will not connect your name with your responses.

Originally created as part of the Healthy Animals, Healthy People workshop series in California, the survey is now open to all owners and small-scale producers of livestock and poultry in California regardless of workshop attendance.

We would appreciate your time and participation in this survey by October 15.

2019 NATIONAL 4-H SHOOTING SPORTS WORKSHOP—OCTOBER 20-23

The 2019 National 4-H Shooting Sports Workshop will be held at the Rock Eagle 4-H Center, Eatonton, Georgia,

The workshop registration/check in is from 3:00 pm to 5:00 pm on Sunday, October 20 with the program beginning at 6:00 pm. Participants are expected to arrive on time to participate in all parts of the program through Wednesday evening, October 23. Overnight accommodations are included for Wednesday night with participants departing on Thursday morning, Oct. 24.

The registration fee listed includes the cost of meals, lodging, meeting rooms, ranges, accident insurance, class materials and supplies. The workshop is being supported by the National Shooting Sports Foundation, Federal Ammunition and other donor supporters.

We would encourage you to <u>review the eligibility criteria</u> for attending the National Instructor Level II Workshop posted at the bottom of the page. Those interested in attending this event will need to support the state training team upon completing this course.

Registration fees and deadlines as follows:

September 20, 2019: \$350 per person

Sept. 21 - Oct. 4, 2019: \$400 per person

Registration fee is based on when complete application and payment are received through the online registration system.

State Coordinators are required to register your participants online. Registration fee includes meals, lodging, meeting rooms, ranges, accident insurance, class materials and supplies.

Participants will lodge in the newer style cabins at Rock Eagle. There are six (6) rooms per cabin. Each room has its own bathroom and temperature control. The central living area has comfortable chairs, a couch and small tables/chairs. The entertainment center with satellite television will be open since ours is an adult group. There is a mini-fridge in the "adult" room if any medications need to be stored. The "adult" room has two single beds. The other five rooms have two sets of bunkbeds. We will house two people to a room allowing all to have bottom bunks. One of the rooms has a handicap accessible bathroom. Linens (sheets, bedspread, towels, and washcloths), small soap and shampoo will be provided on Sunday for the week. Please bring toiletries needed.

Cancellation/Refund Policy

If you need to cancel your registration for any reason the following policy applies. A \$100 cancellation fee will apply or the registration may be transferred to another suitable person if notification is at least one week in advance of the training and the individual registers for the same discipline. The new person will need to fill out all forms.

Criteria

In order for a participant to attend a National 4-H Shooting Sports Workshop, he/she must meet the following:

Participants must be a minimum of 21 years of age. Have state 4-H (Level 1) certification in the discipline in which enrolled. (With State training opportunities limited in the Western Heritage discipline, teaching experiences in similar programs or in other disciplines will be considered.) Please understand that this is a National 4-H (Level 2) instructor training with the expectation that the participant return to their respective state to become a member of their state training team where they will commit to assist in teaching one state workshop annually for 3 years.

- Have a minimum level of 2 years as a Level 1 with experience teaching in the discipline to be determined by each discipline instructor (s).
- Have interest in 4-H, positive youth development, and S.T.E.M.
- Endorse the Train-the-Trainer concept in 4-H Shooting Sports.
- Have experience teaching youth and/or adults.
- Have current 4-H Volunteer status or Extension Faculty status in their state.
- Have been recommended by their State 4-H Shooting Sports Coordinator.

The National 4-H Western Heritage Conference and Invitational Match was held for the first time ever in California July 30 – August 1, 2019. California hosted about 100 4-H youth, parents, and volunteers from seven states at River Oaks Range in Winton, CA. The Western Heritage project is aimed at educating youth not only in firearms safety, but also engaging them in living history and public speaking. Participation in the project requires members to learn the safe handling of firearms through shooting a variety of cowboy action style stages for time, as well as learning about

U.S. history from 1860-1900. They must also develop and present a 3-5 minute "Persona" where they dress in period appropriated clothing and demonstrate their historical knowledge to a panel of judges.
