Mexican Cornbread

2 eggs

1 cup sour cream (or substitute buttermilk)

1/4 cup oil

1 cup cream-style corn or whole kernel corn

16 cups corn meal mix

1 teaspoon salt

2 tablespoons chopped green

peppers

2 jalapeno peppers, chopped

1 cup grated cheese

1/4 cup chopped onion

Mix all ingredients. Bake for 25 minutes at 425 degrees.

1 package pistachio instant pudding

1/2 to 1 cup pecans

3/4 cup miniature marshmallows

1 large container whipped topping


