The email goes to the address you entered in the registration system last year. For online assistance you can fill out a form for our enrollment administrator who will get back to you and help with the enrollment process. WHAT EXACTLY IS PRESENTATION DAY?

4-H presentations are a special sharing time when members show the skills they've acquired to others. Presentation Day gives 4-H members the opportunity to show others what they have learned in their current 4-H projects.

WHAT IS A PRESENTATION?

It is a planned demonstration or illustrated talk which explains or illustrates by using examples. To demonstrate is to teach by showing –learning by doing! Show someone how to tie his shoes, or his 4-H tie! Demonstrating is teaching in the clearest and simplest method known. When members are enrolled in 4-H they have a desire to learn. In giving presentations, they share with others their acquired knowledge.

Boys and girls like to "tell others". This is natural. They should be encouraged to start by giving a simple presentation and, as they develop, they can do more difficult presentations.

WHY GIVE A PRESENTATION?

Presentations help 4-H members:

- do and learn learn and do.
- develop an ability to speak before a group.
- share acquired knowledge and skill.
- develop creativity.
- gain experience in teamwork.
- gain self-confidence, leadership and initiative.
- gain personal recognition.
- have a more interesting and active 4-H project

Every club and project group should devote time to presentations.

Presentations by 4-H members should be a vital part of every 4-H club program. A desirable goal for each 4-H club is to have every member give at least one presentation during the year.

Composting: Yard waste and Worm Composting

There is no better way to improve your soil and the health of your garden that to add compost to the soil. This class will teach you about the various methods of making compost from yard waste and clippings then how and when to apply it to your garden. If you start applying compost to your garden you will find you really have a green thumb after all.

The class will also teach you about using worms to compost household fruit and vegetable waste. The resulting worm compost is amazing material.

Class is free and open to the public.

4-H Record Books

The 4-H program has a long history of record keeping. The focus reflects the importance of this life skill in our daily lives. In 4-H, young people have tracked their activities, events, profits and losses, skill development and learning experiences, and much more using the iconic 4-H Record Book. In addition to record keeping, the 4-H Record Book gives members an opportunity to reflect on their year, measure their achievements and growth, and set goals, and develop plans to meet those goals.

Why have 4-H record books?

- 4-H Record Books serve a variety of purposes in the California 4-H Youth Development Program.
- 4-H Record Books give members an opportunity to reflect on their yearly work. They document their skill development and their learning experiences in a written report. 4-H members measure their achievements and growth in their total years in 4-H.
- 4-H Record Books encourage members to set goals, pursue strategies to meet those goals, and to shift gears in the face of challenges and obstacles. Completion of the Personal Development Report awards 4-H members for participation in 4-H activities, which provides an incentive for participation, learning, and achievement.

Completing a 4-H Record Book is a process where 4-H members record project and club work. Records management (RM) is a competency skill to identify, create, classify, archive, and preserve records. The 4-H Record Book teaches 4-H members these skills through a standard format.

4-H Record Books are not required for membership or for participation in 4-H activities such as club events and activities, or for attending 4-H camps or conferences. A 4-H Record Books may be required to receive participation awards (such as star ranking, medals or pins based on 4-H Record Book achievements).

Record Book Competitions: Provides an incentive to members to record their project work and personal achievement in their 4-H Record Book. Members receive feedback and encouragement on their 4-H project skill development, leadership and citizenship development, and record-keeping skills. Members are recognized for outstanding 4-H work.

Where and how are 4-H record books reviewed and judged?

4-H Record Book Competitions

Club Review

4-H Record Books are first reviewed at the local level by 4-H Community Club/Unit Leaders and Project Leaders. Club level judging is based on the Danish system where 4-H Record Books are judged against a standard. Seals are awarded based on the member's 4-H project work, personal growth and the book's organization. Through their personal achievements and 4-H participation, members may earn Star Rank recognition.

4-H State Fashion Revue 2011

The **State 4-H Fashion Revue** committee announces categories and service projects for **2012**! Entry categories returning from 2011 will be Traditional, Consumer Science Purchased (with \$100 limit), and Wearable Art-Embellished. The Recycled category will not be offered at State Fashion Revue for 2012; counties may choose to include it at local events only. The \$15 Challenge was so popular in 2011, it will become the \$19.99 Challenge for 2012. It has the same rules (shoes and sales tax don't count, receipts required) but the limit is increased to \$19.99 to allow more creativity. We are adding a second challenge, called the Bag Up Fashion Challenge. Sew a tote bag from Simplicity #7161, view A only, and model it with a garment or garments that coordinate with the tote bag. SFR will be coordinating two service projects. The Quilts for Wounded Warriors is returning because the American Legion needs more quilts. Statewide, 4-H created sixty quilts in 2011 and we look forward to even more in 2012. Our second service activity is the Million Pillowcase Project, for handmade or decorated pillowcases. Dear 4-H Youth Delegates:

You are cordially invited to attend the 20th annual C.A.L. Conference at Walker Creek Ranch on January 27, 28, and 29 2012.

C.A.L. is a sectional 4-H event and members from all North Central Section counties are encouraged to attend. Participants share their knowledge, exchange ideas and information, and have the chance to develop and enhance their leadership skills. Each attendee is expected to participate fully.

Registration is accepted on a first come, first served basis. Each county is allotted 15 youth delegate spaces. The Conference fee is \$150 which includes room and board on Friday and Saturday, all three meals on Saturday and breakfast on Sunday; the cost is \$160 if you would like to purchase a conference T-shirt. You must complete the following forms and turn them in to your county office to reserve your spot at the conference by **November 30, 2011**:

Another leadership opportunity available is serving as a cabin leader. We ask that all cabin leaders have attended C.A.L. Conference at least one previous C.A.L. A PRESENTATION IS A FORM OF TEACHING USING VISUAL AND VERBAL METHODS OF COMMUNICATION.

Presentations are shared outcomes of the presenter's own learning and experience. Presentations may be given by one or more persons.

Young people gain in confidence and competence each time they organize and give a presentation. Presentations are one of the strongest teaching tools available to us. Social research verifies that our highest knowledge retention comes when we see, say and do. Sharing knowledge and skills with a receptive, appreciative audience builds confidence and a sense of personal self-worth.

Presentations are shared outcomes of the presenter's own learning and experience. Presentations may be given by one or more persons. Young people gain in confidence and competence each time they organize and give a presentation. Presentations are one of the strongest teaching tools available to us. Social research verifies that our highest knowledge retention comes when we see, say and do. Sharing knowledge and skills with a receptive, appreciative audience builds confidence and a sense of personal self-worth.

TYPE OF PRESENTATIONS: VERBAL & VISUAL

VERBAL: SAYING THE PRESENTATION

*DEMONSTRATION/ILLUSTRATED TALK: A planned Presentation and Illustrated talk that teaches by the "show how method" some skill or

knowledge. Primary through intermediate members should prepare a 3 to 10 minute presentation. Advanced members should provide a 5 to 10 minute presentation. At the end of each presentation the judges will ask questions. Use posters or other visuals to more effectively teach or illustrate concepts or practices. An Illustrated Talk teaches a skill using posters only. Team members should share presentation responsibilities.

- * <u>PUBLIC SPEAKING:</u> An organized speech or lecture 3 to 5 minutes in length, in which the presenter explains, informs or argues a point. No visuals should be used.
- * SHARE THE FUN: A planned and rehearsed talent act, skit or playlet, performed by one or more youth to entertain. Share the Fun presentations may include props and costumes. Timing should be appropriate to the act, 10 to 15 minutes.

VISUAL: DISPLAYING THE PRESENTATION

- * DISPLAYS: During the County or Regional Presentation Day events, 4-H members entering visual or non-live presentations will be asked to stand by their presentation for a period of time to answer questions and visit with evaluators. A display is an organized visual presentation of material that illustrates a process or a concept. Displays should be designed to convey their message in a limited amount of time (60 seconds or the time that a passerby will spend by the display.) 4-H members may select one of the following kinds of displays:
- 1. Card table size area (approximately 30"x30" flat space) this display may include a poster. Table space will be provided.
- 2. Panel display (no larger than 4'x4') this is a vertical display. It must be self supporting.
- * <u>SLIDES</u>: Organized informational or instructional programs using slide equipment. Five to 10 minute slide presentation should be supplemented with a written script or a synchronized tape recording. Provide your own slide/tape equipment.
- * <u>VIDEO:</u> A video providing instructions or information about your chosen topic. Five to 10 minutes in length and you must provide your own video equipment.
