Our nutrition education program delivers science-based information to children and adults so they can improve their diets, prevent disease, and live healthier lives. Through the 4-H program, we advance the science of youth development and provide Butte County youth opportunities to learn about STEM, healthy living, civic engagement, and leadership, preparing them for successful lives as young adults. Our volunteer Master Gardeners offer free home horticulture advice to County residents, promoting the adoption of sustainable gardening practices.

Grants fund research and outreach activities. Gifts supplement grants and support the 4-H and Master Gardener programs.

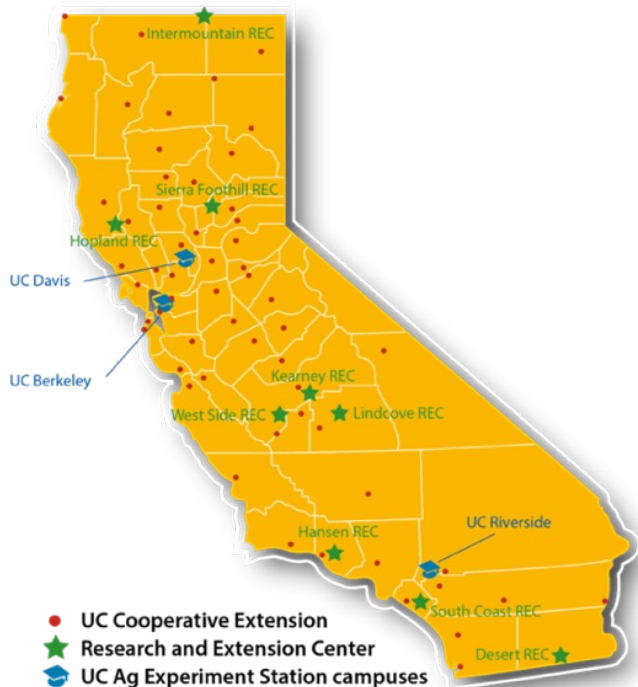


Support Group of Butte County UCCE
