<u>Successes</u>

Reached 132,654 county-wide with indirect education, 25,435 newly reached.

Reached 4,131 total participants with direct nutrition, physical activity & garden-based education.

90% of pre-kindergarten and 1st grade teachers agree or strongly agree that compared to the beginning of the school year, more students now can identify healthy food choices.

Results

Youth

46% of surveyed middle & high school youth increased the number of times they ate vegetables yesterday.

Adult

92% of adults surveyed intend to increase the frequency of making a list the next time they grocery shop.

Of the 72 participants completing pre/post Plan, Shop, Save & Cook survey, 85% reported improvement in the frequency of using at least one of the five food resource management behaviors.

Improving California's Health Through CalFresh Healthy Living

County Statement:

The CalFresh Healthy Living, UCCE Riverside program (CFHL, UCCE) works with low-resource schools and community organizations to promote healthy eating, gardening, active living, and adoption of policy, systems, and environmental initiatives that can contribute to improved, long term health outcomes.

Serving Individuals and Communities

- Reached over 3,200 youth & over 400 adults with direct education.
- Provided 10 classes at Department of Public Social Services Offices, reaching 151 adults.

Providing Education

- Reached 367 early childhood (ECE-Transitional Kinder) in district-wide direct education with *Go Glow Grow* curriculum.
- Reached 2,739 Kinder through 12th grade youth with direct education in My Amazing Body, Good for Me & You, TWIGS, Up4It!, EatFit, Discovering Healthy Choices, & Hunger Attack curricula.

Helping to Make Organizational and Environmental Changes

• 64 Policy, systems, & environmental changes adopted at 26 sites including 15 Smarter Mealtimes and 1 Smarter Lunchrooms Movement pre/post needs assessment scorecards.

Serving California Agriculture

- Supported 12 gardens
 - 9 school gardens
 - 3 community gardens

Building Partnerships

54 Partnerships including:

- Torres Martinez Desert Cahuilla Indians to facilitate monthly consultative Community Wellness Committee and nutrition & garden workshops and community garden support in partnership with UCCE.
- Coachella Valley USD to provide nutrition education for the USDA's Fresh Fruit & Vegetable Program at 4 schools and reach 137 Adult School participants with the Plan, Shop, Save & Cook series.

 Desert Sands USD ECE to enroll ECE sites district-wide in GGG and provide teacher training to 45 ECE teachers and para educators.





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
