Youth are eligible to participate in 4-H if they meet the following criteria:

Primary Member - Must be 5 years old by December 31 of the program year. Primary members cannot enroll in large animal or shooting sports projects.

Junior, Intermediate, and Senior

Members - Must be 9 years old by December 31 of the program year and may continue in the program until the end of the calendar year in which they become 19 years of age.
