Welcome to Our New and Returning 4-H Families!

Welcome to all new and returning members, families and leaders. 4-H clubs in Calaveras County are still accepting new members.

We are looking forward to another educational and fun 4-H year. 4-H is a great opportunity to meet new people and learn lots of interesting things. Your project leaders and community club leaders are there to help, and are great resources for a productive 4-H experience. Again, welcome and welcome back!

All 4-H activities are led by volunteers. If you and your child want to have a positive and educational 4-H program, it is up to you to take an active part. Consider teaching a project, by yourself or with a friend. You could plan a club activity or fundraiser. Don't expect other parents to do all of the work so your child can enjoy 4-H. We are a strong organization because of the strength of our active volunteers. You don't have to be asked! Step up and say you can help! Your family will have more fun if you're involved.

As a gentle reminder, California 4-H requirement that there be at least 2 adults at every 4-H activity: one must be a certified adult 4-H leader and one can be another adult. One must be at least age 21. Parents, please volunteer to be that additional adult or the leader cannot have the project meeting. If you are dropping off a child, make sure that the second adult is already there. Actually, we hope you do not just drop off your child, as 4-H encourages family involvement. For safety or supervision reasons, some project leaders may require that parents stay with their children. This is a mandatory requirement for primary members.

Who Is A 4-H Leader?

A 4-H leader is an adult volunteer who has been certified through the 4-H Office. Adults who are not 4-H volunteers cannot hold project meetings regardless of whether a 4-H leader is present or not. IRONSTONE CONCOURS d'ELEGANCE - Sign Up Now!

Saturday, September 26

Ironstone Concours d'Elegance is a classic car show on the grounds of Ironstone Winery in Murphys. It is a fund raiser for 4-H in the foothill counties, FFA, and State Fair scholarships. 4-H members and families volunteer to help with the event and in return, the Ironstone Concours Foundation helps support our program.

How can you help? We need members of all ages to give presentations, bring project displays, bake cookies, and work in the different venues at the event.

Presentations can be individual or team and are given from 11-12:30. The impromptu speaking contest is 12:30-1:30. Displays are set up from 9:30-2. Members stay with their displays to talk to the general public about 4-H. We recommend members with displays have partners so each person can take breaks to see the car show. Presentations and displays can be about any 4-H project or activity. Small live animals are always an attraction. Members bringing animals must supply their own cages or pens.

Each of the 5 foothill counties (El Dorado, Amador, Calaveras, Tuolumne, and Mariposa) is responsible to supply 15 dozen home-made cookies for the award bags given to the sponsors and car show winners. They should be packaged 4-6 per Ziploc bag and must be delivered that day by 9 am. Contact the county office if you can bake cookies and we will arrange for drop off and delivery.

4-H members of all ages and adults to supervise are needed to take tickets, hand out programs, assemble the award bags, and assist in the merchandise booth. Teen members assist with the buffet lunch in the Music Room and hand out welcome baskets to the car show entries. All Stars help with the Gala Lunch and the Awards Ceremony.

Admission and lunch are free for 4-H members volunteering and/or presenting. Admission is free for supervising 4-H adults. Adults signing up to work at the various venues will receive lunch tickets. Lunch is also available for purchase. General admission to the Concours is \$20 per adult or \$35 per couple, and children under 14 are free. A coupon for \$5 off the \$35 fee is available at

Adults, please dress appropriately for an upscale car show.

2016 Salute to Excellence 4-H Volunteer Awards

Information & Deadlines

The National 4-H Salute to Excellence Volunteer Recognition Award recognizes 4-H volunteers who demonstrate exemplary service to 4-H, while promoting service through volunteerism as both an opportunity and a privilege.

California will be nominating two volunteers to be considered as regional honorees. The regional honorees become nominees for the national award, and one volunteer in each category will be named the national honoree.

Selection Criteria

- 1. The *Volunteer of the Year Award* (VOY) is for currently serving 4-H volunteers who have served as 4-H volunteers for **less than 10 years** at the local, county, district or state level.
- 2. The *Outstanding Lifetime Volunteer Award* (OLV) is for current or former 4-H volunteers who have served **10 or more years** at the local, county, district or state level.

Please take the time to nominate outstanding individual volunteers using the <u>Nomination Application</u>. Mail completed nomination packet(s) to the UC ANR, State 4-H Office, Attn: Shannon Horrillo, 2801 Second Street, Davis, CA 95618. Nomination Packets must be received **by September 25**th.

If multiple nomination packets are received they will be reviewed by the 4-H Incentives and Recognition Advisory Committee who will recommend one nominee for each category to the Associate Director of 4-H Program and Policy for final approval. Please note there is no limitation on the number of nominees from each county.

Livestock Quiz Bowl

The State 4-H Office will be hosting a livestock quiz bowl at the Grand National Exposition, Horse Show and Rodeo at Cow Palace on October 17th. This event is open to both 4-H and FFA members, and the top 4-H team and the top FFA team at this contest will be eligible to compete at the Western National Round Up in Denver, Colorado in January.

Eligibility

- 1. Each 4-H county and FFA chapter may enter multiple teams of four (4) or five (5) contestants. One team member will be designated as an alternate if five (5) are entered. Teams may be selected by any procedure, which the club/chapter deems appropriate.
- 2. Contestant must already have passed his or her 14th birthday, and may not have reached his or her 19th birthday, as of January 1 of the current year.
- 3. All contestants must be members of 4-H or FFA in the 4-H county/FFA chapter they represent.
- 4. Contestants may not have participated in post-secondary coursework in the subject area of this competition, nor has he or she participated in training for post-secondary competition in the subject area of this competition. Violation of this will result in forfeiture of any awards or recognition which has been won in this Competitive Event.
- 5. An individual may enter a National 4-H competitive event in a specific program area only once. Participating members of a team entry are ineligible to enter the same event again as a part of another team. Any individual who has participated in a National 4-H or FFA competitive event in a specific program area may not enter the same event at the state level.
