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

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






Chapter 1 Building the Foundation (pre-2001)

- 1995 -Tahoe Re-green response to beetle killed trees
- 1997 Lake Tahoe Presidential Forum provided funds for a Fire History Study, mechanical fuels treatment, urban lot management, prescribed burning (LTBMU)

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

The New Era of Wildfire Awareness


- The Martis Fire, June 17, 2001 and the Gondola Fire July 2, 2002, raise wildfire awareness to a new level.
- Living with Fire guidelines adopted for defensible space -2003
- Healthy Forest Restoration Act Dec. 2003
- TRPA Updated Code of Ordinances & 208 Plan to allow low-impact mechanized equipment in SEZs for fuel reduction work -Jan. 2004
- Nuts and Bolts 2004 Action Plan March 2004

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Gondola Fire: July 2, 2002 673 acres





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






Living with Fire Adopted 2003

- Interagency working group included all agencies and Fire Protection Districts
- A full perimeter 0-5' noncombustible zone will be a universal prescription
- Maintain a Lean, Clean and Green Zone from 5'-30'
- Wildland Fuel Reduction Zone 30-100'



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Healthy Forest Restoration Act 2003



- Nuts and Bolts Fuel Reduction Plan provided first estimates of acres and costs for WUI treatments
- Nevada and California Legislators challenge Basin agencies to complete CWPPs by the August Tahoe Summit
- CWPPs delivered at the Tahoe Summit

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



The Angora Fire, June 24, 2007 changed everything.



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The Angora Fire – Overview

- Start Date: Sunday June 24, 2007, 2:25pm
- Ignition Source: Illegal Camp Fire
- Wind Speed: 12-22 mph Gusts: 40 mph
- Burned 3,100 acres
- 254 Residences, 75 Commercial Structures
- Resources: 2,180 firefighters
- Suppression Cost: \$11.7 Million (\$3775/Acre)
- Containment: July 2, 2007

- Lahontan Water Board updated Timber Waiver
- FPDs performing WUI treatments and running defensible space programs including tree marking and permitting
- CWPPs and 10-Year Fuels Strategy (Including updates)

- Large landscapes Lake Tahoe West Partnership











