What to Bring for the burn day on November 6th: November 5<sup>th</sup> will be indoors. November 6<sup>th</sup> will be an outdoor day, either with burning or a field trip. For the burn we will provide equipment, tools, and supervision/instruction. If you have Nomex fire clothes, please feel free to bring them. We will have some Nomex shirts to lend to participants who don't have them. On the 6<sup>th</sup> please bring your own:

- Long pants (natural fiber like cotton, wool, or other fire-resistant material)
- Sturdy leather work or hiking boots (no steel toes)
- A pair of leather gloves
- Eye protection, either sunglasses or safety glasses
- Water bottle.
- A hand tool like a shovel, rake, or fire tool (McCloed) and make sure its marked/identified (if you have one otherwise we will provide them).
- Comfortable day pack if you desire

Weather: The weather next week is forecast to have a high in the low 60s and a low in the low 30s.
