Awards will be given after June 1st at a location or 4-H event determined by the county office.

This award may be earned every year by establishing a new garden in the community.

Objective:

To honor Scott Michael Deane, a 4-Her who loved seeds, flowers and gardens of any kind. Scotty loved his community and brought a smile to everyone's heart who knew him.

Parameters:

The garden must at least be 2 feet by 3 feet or 6 square feet or larger.

The garden may start any time during the standard 4-H year but must be completed by May 31 of the same year.

This record must be completed and turned in by June 1 of the same year.

<p><u>Choose a Location</u></p> <p>1. Consider the following suggestions however the participant is not limited to these suggestions: Libraries, schools, 4-H Office, fairground, convalescent homes, community meeting places, churches, daycares, Boys and Girls Clubs, government offices, hospitals, fire and police stations, community shelters, YMCA, parks, etc.</p> <p>2. Make sure that you receive approval from the appropriate people before you begin planting.</p>		
<p><u>Design the Garden</u></p> <p>1. On a sheet of paper make a sketch of the garden you intend to plant. You may use any type of plant material including trees, shrubs perennials, annuals, bulbs and seeds.</p> <p>2. Figure the cost of your plan.</p>		
<p><u>Raise Funds**</u></p> <p>Consider requesting donations from</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Local Merchants 2. Existing 4-H Club monies 3. Family and Friends 4. Planned Fundraisers <p><i>**All fund raising must follow existing 4-H policies.</i></p>		
<p><u>Establish Water Source</u></p> <p>Identify or choose a water source that is appropriate for the garden that you are planting.</p> <p>Consider:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Yearly rainfall 2. Drip irrigation 3. Sprinklers 		



<p><u>Plan Garden Maintenance</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Transfer the upkeep of the garden to a community representative or established maintenance worker. 2. Tend the garden yourself throughout the year. 		
<p><u>Plant the Garden</u></p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Prepare the soil. 2. Plant the garden. 3. Complete the irrigation system if necessary.
