Parameters:

The garden must at least be 2 feet by 3 feet or 6 square feet or larger.

The garden may start any time during the standard 4-H year but must be completed by May 31 of the

Establish Water Source		
Identify or choose a water source that is appropriate for the garden that you are planting. Consider: 1. Yearly rainfall 2. Drip irrigation 3. Sprinklers		

Plan Garden Maintenance		
Transfer the upkeep of the garden to a community representative or established maintenance worker.		
2. Tend the garden yourself throughout the year.		
Plant the Garden		
1. Prepare the soil.		
2. Plant the garden.		
3. Complete the irrigation system if necessary.
