# 28<sup>th</sup> Annual Natural Resources Science Camp for High School Students - 2012 Applications now Available



## Mark your calendars for this great opportunity!

April 20<sup>th</sup> is the deadline for submitting applications for Range Camp! Range Camp is a week-long camp experience for students ages 15-18 who have an interest in the science and conservation of natural resources in California. The camp, celebrating its 28<sup>th</sup> year, is put on by the California-Pacific section of the Society for Range Management. Students learn plant identification, principles of livestock and wildlife management, forestry, fire ecology, hydrology and water quality, geology and soils, and management of stream and river environments. Field activities include learning to read wildlife 'sign', outdoor navigation with compasses, maps and GPS, forest management, a tour of a working ranch, and a beach BBQ. Sessions are taught by faculty from the University of California, staff from local, state and federal agencies, and private professional scientists and natural resource management specialists. Range Camp runs from June 17<sup>th</sup>-22<sup>nd</sup> at the University of California's Elkus Youth Ranch just south of Half Moon Bay. Information and applications are available at <http://www.rangelands.org/casrm/HTML/rangecamps.html>. Cost is \$400.00. Applications will be considered after the deadline on a space available basis.

This is a unique opportunity for students thinking about college to learn about university-level courses of study in agriculture and natural resources, and for students looking for job opportunities to talk with a variety of professionals whose careers touch on their areas of interest.

The Society for Range Management will send the top two campers as representatives to a national high school youth forum held concurrently with its annual science conference in Oklahoma City, OK in February of 2013.

# County Wide Nigerian Dwarf Project

Why join the Nigerians group you may ask yourself? The best reason is that we have lots of fun in the project. It is a breeding project and you have goats 24/7. Some say that it is a lot of work, it is not like the market projects where you get your animal in Feb and they are gone by June. We also don't make very much money. We sell babies in the spring time. They bring from \$50 for a wether (that is a fix boy) to very expensive show does, most of our Does go for around \$300. Most of us in the project also have made goat soaps, lotions, cheese, and deserts from the milk we get from our goats. It takes a while to learn to milk but it is a great skill to know if you are serious about the project. Two really exciting field trips we went on in our project were the ultra sound trip and UC Davis Goats days. This year is our 5th ultra sound day; John Openshaw is an ultrasound practitioner from the Modesto area. John comes to Darla house (one of our leaders) and we set up a stanchion and all the 4-Hers in the project can bring their animal to see how many babies their does are pregnant with. John can point out heart beats, skull size, embryo age, and yes even the sex of some the kids. For the most part everyone is very excited about the babies but every once in a while there is an open doe (one who is not pregnant) and that is very sad for the owner. John is always willing to teach as we go along.

UC Davis goat day covers AI (artificial insemination), Ultra Sound, Health Exam and how a Necropsy is actually done. Every year Davis also does milk testing licensing. The best class at goat day was on Cheese making which is also a new goat project you can join next year. You don't even have to have a goat to join.

All in all El Dorado's Nigerian goat project is having a blast this year. We have over 50 4-Her's in the group, how fun is that.


