New Federal Regulations to Impact Livestock Producers

As of January 1, 2017, all medically-important antibiotics for use in or on feed and in water will require a Veterinary Feed Directive (VFD) or a prescription. This new regulation will affect all livestock producers including 4-H and FFA members.

The State 4-H Office, in coordination with the UC Davis Veterinary Medicine Extension, and the California

Department of Food and Agriculture will be presenting a one-hour webinar on multiple dates to further explain the new regulations and their implications.



The College of Agricultural and Environmental Sciences will be holding its 41st Annual Agricultural and Environmental Sciences Field Day on Friday, March 3 and Saturday, March 4, 2017. This Field Day is open to FFA and 4-H high school students from California and surrounding states. These high school students come to Davis to compete in 25 different agriculturally based judging contests, ranging from livestock judging to agriculture computer applications. UC Davis students from a variety of majors coordinate the contests. Faculty and staff in CA&ES and local community members serve as advisers for these contests.



4-H Gist Factory Tour

On January 16, 2017 the El Dorado County wide 4-H horse project took a field trip to Gist Factory. During the field trip each 4H-er designed a personal key chain/halter tag that Gist will custom make for them. When they were not taking a tour to see how the buckles are made there was educational presentations provided by the wonderful horse teen leaders. The tour went into the behind the scenes of the Gist factory and showed each individual part into making a buckle.





The business was started in 1968 by Chad Gist's father who provided a brief company history. The company employees @100 people and relocated to Placerville in 1990. There are over 30 steps in the buckle making process. One buckle can take up to 100 hours in labor to design and create. Gist make approximately 25,000 buckles a year. Gist buckles are proudly worn all over the world including Denver Bronco Superbowl Champions and Garth Brooks.

Bethaney Gist, one of our project leaders and owners daughter in law organized the tour and lunch for the County-Wide Horse Group. Melody and Aubrey Gist, 4H members and the owners grand-daughters helped on the behind the scene tour.

Seeing how the buckles were made showed how much talent, skill and effort are put into every buckle.

This gave everyone a whole new perspective and appreciation for their buckles. Going on this field trip was a great experience that I recommend to other 4-Hers so they get to see the generosity of the Gist family and how much they do for 4-H.


