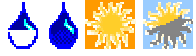




Pineapple Sage

Salvia elegans



Attractive clumping perennial growing to 4' and producing spikes of long, tubular red flowers in winter and spring.

Foliage smells like pineapple and can be used to make tea.

Spreads slowly by underground runners.

To maintain shape and productivity, cut back older stems as new growth appears.

Excellent winter food source for hummingbirds.

Other: Good drainage. Attracts hummingbirds.
