The class will include information on how to reduce future tree mortality; reforestation do's and don'ts; information on when and how to water different plantings effectively; tips on thinning overcrowded vegetation, removing slash and maintaining defensible space;

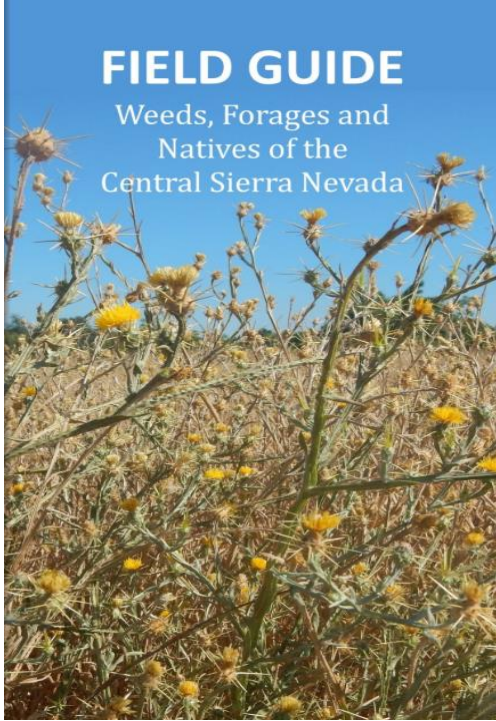
