The State 4-H Field Day is California 4-H's largest educational event for 4-H youth members and 4-H volunteers. This event was initiated by a 4-H youth member and 4-H staff partner in 2002 as a public speaking evaluation activity for 100 youth. It has grown to include contests and activities engaging people of all ages. 4-H youth and adult volunteers and staff continue to partner to plan and implement all of the activities and contests.

The goal of the event is to provide a culminating experience for 4-H members in their yearlong 4-H education.



### State level competitions

State Fashion Revue and State Presentation Events have qualifying requirements from County-level competitions. The State Plant Science contest is a qualifier for national competition.

Contests without qualifying requirements allow 4-H members to compete and learn from 4-H competitors from throughout California. This event strengthens a number of important extended learning practices.

#### <u>Leadership Opportunities for 4-H Members ages 14 years and older:</u>

**Counselor (including line and cabin positions):** Responsible for the campers' safety and being a positive role model. Overseeing the cabin area and keeping

campers on schedule. Assist campers with cabin activities, chores and at bedtime. Work with a camper group during dining hall, activities, events, and flagpole.

**Workshop Counselor:** Responsible for organizing, setting up and overseeing a specific area, program, or activity. For Example: arts/crafts, sports, woodworking, kitchen, outdoor cooking/survival skills, archery, nature walks/hiking, fencing, line/swing dancing, special projects, campfire, evening activities, dining hall, etc. May require additional meetings or trainings.

# Animal Ownership & Supervision Requirements

4-H members: If you plan to show or exhibit your animal project at a fair, exposition, sponsored show, etc, please review the following timeframes in order to meet 4-H eligibility requirements. For more information, please see Ch. 7 of the policy handbook, IV. Fairs, Expositions, and Other Sponsored Shows.

- Poultry must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days.
- Rabbits must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days.
- Feeder and breeding animals – must be owned and supervised for not less than 30 consecutive days and be enrolled in the project for not less than 60 consecutive days.
- Market sheep, swine, veal and goats – must be owned and supervised for not less than 60 consecutive days.
- Market beef must be owned and supervised for





# 4-H Online Enrollment Changes Ahead

The University of California 4-H
Youth Development program is
increasing the focus of online
system security, reducing our risk of
security breaches and cyberattacks. Our new UC ANR Chief
Information Security Officer has
updated UC ANR's security
standards, resulting in the need to
identify a new 4-H enrollment
system vendor that meets these
updated requirements.

As such, this program year (2022-2023) will be the last year we will be using Registration Max's 4-H Online enrollment system.

Going forward into the 2023-2024 program year, we will be using ZSuite as our new enrollment system vendor.

To complete this exciting transition, family login level access to the 4-H Online 2.0 system will be turned off on June 23rd at 12pm. Families and volunteers will no longer be able to login to the enrollment system.

Families are encouraged to complete enrollments for the 2022-2023 program year prior to June 23rd.

- not less than 120 consecutive days.
- Horses must be owned/leased and supervised for not less than 120 consecutive days. Male foals may be shown by 4-H members, but yearling and older stallions are ineligible as 4-H projects. The age of the horse shall be computed on the basis of a calendar vear starting on January 1 of the year foaled; it is a weanling during the calendar year in which foaled, and a yearling during the first calendar year following its foaling date, regardless of year foaled.
- Llamas & Alpacas must be owned/leased and supervised for not less than 120 consecutive days.

Families are also encouraged to delay re-enrollment for the 2023-2024 program year until the new system is open and they can complete the online self-enrollment process on or after August 15, 2023.

If enrollment or re-enrollment is necessary during the interim period the system is offline, your county staff will work with you to complete the enrollment process.

Please note all dates listed are subject to change based on RegistrationMax, ZSuite and UC ANR 4-H needs. Any changes will be broadly communicated by the State 4-H Office.



### Youth Protection: Ch. 11, IV. C.

There will be at least two (2) appointed adult volunteers present with members during all 4-H led activities. "Appointed adult

volunteer" means an individual that has completed the 4-H Adult Volunteer Appointment or Re-Appointment process (see Ch. 6, Volunteer Appointment and Re-Appointment Confirmation).

- When staff and 4-H units design in person 4-H activities, they
  must plan to ensure that two appointed adults volunteers are
  present with members during the activities. Activities cannot
  be planned in advance with the expectation that only 1
  appointed volunteer is needed and another adult can be
  present.
- Only on rare occasions, due to an emergency of one appointed volunteer or another unforeseeable circumstance, would it be permissible for the activity to proceed with 1 appointed adult volunteer and another adult participant.
- Youth protection is a cornerstone of 4-H. As such, decisions and delivery of the 4-H program are intended to be designed in a way that upholds youth protection as a priority.

# <u>4-H Policy reminder: Fundraising and CA State Sales</u> Tax

4-H may not sell items that require collecting and reporting sales taxes.

In general, the sale of items not made or produced by group participants such as t-shirts, wrapping paper, mugs, stuffed animals, etc. are subject to California sales tax.

4-H Policy, <u>Chapter 9, XV, C</u>, outlines California State Sales Tax related to Taxable items. Please see the <u>California State Sales Tax FAQ</u> for more information. All 4-H staff and units need to reference this policy as the starting point when considering any fundraising opportunities.

Fundraisers that involve items not made or produced by participants would ONLY be possible if ALL of the following criteria could be met:

- 1. Orders are solicited from the public in the name of 4-H.
- 2. The fundraising company, NOT 4-H, is responsible for reporting the sales and remitting sales tax and obtaining seller's permits. (If the 4-H solicits orders, collects payments and distributes tangible personal property for the supplier, it is considered to be the agent of that supplier. In this situation, the supplier is responsible for reporting the sales and remitting any tax due, based on the retail selling price of the merchandise. In this situation the 4-H does not need to obtain a seller's permit.)
- 3. Payments are collected in the name of 4-H;
- 4. **4-H** is responsible for and pays the supplier for the merchandise:

- 5. The contract clearly indicates that the 4-H will purchase and resell the products to its customers.
- 6. The profits from the sales must be used exclusively to support the mission of the 4-H Youth Development Program.

Please note: The above list is not a complete list of items that are subject to CA sales tax.

### **Shooting Sports Event Website**

Each year, the National 4-H Shooting Sports Committee reviews both the National 4-H Shooting Sports Championship Rules and Regulations as well as the Minimum Standards and Best Management Practices of a 4-H Shooting Sports Program. Decisions to edit are based on the safety and education of our youth as well as the integrity of the 4-H program. In keeping with our long-standing philosophies of not participating in simulated combat sports nor shooting at humanoid targets the committee has implemented a new minimum standard, listed below.

The University of California 4-H Youth Development Program has adopted this standard.

Effective Immediately - 1/27/2023

Any firearm built or modified to give the distinct impression of a modern military style firearm such as an AR or AK is not allowed in the 4-H Shooting Sports Program. Listed below are visual examples of, but not limited to, firearms that resemble those not allowed.
