General Blurb – In California, there is over 34 million acres of grazed rangeland. The complexities associated with rangeland management are increasing due to a growing body of scientific research, an expanding public stakeholder base and evolving government policies. This morning session of the workshop will equip ranchers, land managers, technical resources and college students with scientifically based management practices, resources and network to support sustainable livestock grazing enterprises on California’s rangelands. The second half of the workshop will focus on California’s irrigated pasturelands that account for nearly 500,000 acres across the state and rank third among agricultural water users. The workshop will focused on pasture establishment and management for water scarcity, invasive species, and nitrogen management to maximize productivity while balancing natural resource objectives. *This is a field based training with minimal classroom time!*
