- 2. Complete the interest survey at http://ucanr.edu/sonomavolunteer.
- 3. Submit 4-H adult volunteer application online at https://ca.4honline.com.

 Create a family profile, add a new adult application, enter all required information, and submit. 4hOnline adult status will show as awaiting review.
- 4. Complete required "2022-2023 California New Volunteer Training" in eXtension. Go to https://campus.extension.org/enrol/index.php?id=2225. Create a new account, check your email and click on the confirmation link, log into eXtension and click "2022-23 California New Volunteer Training" and enter the code "Sonoma". Courses include: Module 1: 4-H Orientation; Module 2: Foundations of Positive Youth Development; Module 3: Toward an Interculturally Connected 4-H; Module 4: Abuse Risk Management for Volunteers; Module 5: Reporting Child & Abuse Neglect; & Acknowledgement Questionnaire). - 5. Submit \$33 program enrollment fee. Contact your 4-H Club Leader and/or Volunteer Enrollment Coordinator to discuss payment options. Some 4-H Clubs offer credit card payments while others only accept check or cash.
- 6. Complete fingerprint background check Live Scan with the California Department of Justice.

 Complete at any location that provides Live Scan. Fees vary between \$20 and \$60 depending on the provider. TruScan Fingerprinting Services is no or low cost. Ask your 4-H Club Leader or Volunteer Enrollment Coordinator which location they recommend.

- 7. The application is reviewed by the county director. If approved, notification will be sent from 4hOnline.
