## Sonoma County 4-H Council Scholarship Information Packet and Application

Sonoma County 4-H Council awards a total of 10, 10-\$1,000 scholarships from CCC per year

- o Graduating High School Seniors entering a junior college, 4 year college/university, or an accredited trade school.
- Students that have completed their sophomore year, and plan to complete a Bachelor's Degree. Please note, completion of sophomore year, equates to completion of 60 transferrable units.
- Students that have completed their BA/BS and are pursuing their Masters or Doctorate
- o First time CCC Scholarship applicants.

The maximum times, if qualified to receive this award would be twice. If awarded this scholarship, payments will be made in two equal amounts of \$500, one in fall semester and one in spring semester of the school year. Submissions for payment must be received by November 1<sup>st</sup> for the fall semester and March 1<sup>st</sup> for the spring semester. Please include official Enrollment Verification with student's name. Verification must indicate that you are a full time student for both fall and spring semesters. If those deadlines are not met, the scholarship will be forfeited.

- 1. Name, complete address, telephone number, email address, high school attending and graduation date, years enrolled in 4-H program, years completing a 4-H record book, and state if you are applying as a incoming college freshman, first time applicant or as an ongoing college students.
- 1a. <u>If a current college student</u>, please provide above information, and current college name, dates at that college, and college, university, or trade school do you plan to attend next year.
- **2.** List of names of colleges, universities, or trade school to which you have made application. (**ongoing students, do not complete this step.**)
- 3. State your chosen intended major, course of study, trade or technical school.
- 4. Please give a brief statement of your reason for applying for this scholarship; including career plans, goals, objectives, how 4-H has influenced this choice, and how you think your 4-H experiences will help you achieve your educational goals? (maximum one page)
- 5. A summary of your 4-H activities including, major achievements within the program, involvement in community service, and involvement in leadership. (maximum one page)
- 6. A brief summary, (half page) of school service related activities, clubs, etc.
- 7. A copy of your most recent 4-H record book or past all star application.

### **Completed Application Must Include Following Items:**

- 1. Above listed items per academic standing.
- 2. High School graduates include a 7<sup>th</sup> semester grade report (Freshman year through first semester of Senior year), other students include the most recent college, trade school, or university grade report. *They do not have to be official transcripts with the seal*.
- 3. Home Schooled youth---please provide documentation indicating completion of a high school course of study, and grade report as appropriate. If not available, some form of explanation as to why it can not be included.
- 4. Letters of recommendation (3) may be from any source, such as teacher, counselor, 4-H leader. Letters must be in a sealed envelope, signature of writer, on the envelope flap. Letters of recommendation will not be accepted from applicant's relatives.
