Sonoma County Only Categories

County Only Categories do not gualify for State Fashion Revue competition.

Accessories - Create two or more different coordinating accessories made from any material or combination of materials including: fabric, leather, yarn, wire, embroidery floss, duct tape, seed beads, etc. The accessories must coordinate with each other and with the outfit the member chooses to wear with the accessories. The two accessories must be different types of accessories (two hair clips do not qualify, but it can be a hair clip and bracelet) Entry examples: belt, purse, wallet, slippers, jewelry, hat, scarf, gloves, hatband, hair accessories, phone holder, etc.

Embellished – Creatively decorate an existing wearable garment using any variety of embellishing methods including: adding material, paint, dye, embroider thread, trim, beads, sequins, fringe, appliqué, iron-on, lace, etc. Entry must include a picture of the garment before any embellishments.

Non-Garment – Make a non-wearable item using any technique, any materials, and any pattern. Entry examples: laptop carrier, shopping bag, garment bag, blanket, pillowcase, home décor, placemat, holiday décor, teddy bear, item for an animal (bed, blanket, collar, halter cover, lead), etc.

Zero-Waste Challenge: create a garment using pre-consumer or post-consumer zero-waste methods pre-consumer option: use all your fabric (or skein) to create your garment(s) – with no leftover scraps!

If necessary, scraps can become accessories or embellishments. Entry must describe how all material was used.

post-consumer options: Upcycle a garment into a new garment or create a Trashion Fashion garment Upcycle option: Turn existing garment(s) into a new, different, wearable garment. Additional fabrics, trim and supplies may be used. This is not an alteration (ie, don't refit a large dress into a similar small dress). The garment(s) should be cut and remade into a new garment that looks different. Entry must include a picture of the garment before deconstruction.

Trashion Fashion option: Construct a garment using at least 75% recyclable or reused materials that would otherwise be trashed/recycled. Materials should not be new/unused for their original purpose and should not be fabric or clothing. Entry must be clean, safe, and durable. Entry must list all materials used.

County and State Categories

Below is a brief summary of the State category descriptions, see State website for full info & requirements. Consumer Science Purchased, \$50.00 Limit – Purchase an entire outfit for less than \$50, including shoes and all accessories. Tax is not included. Copies of all receipts are required.

Costume Challenge – Create a costume for self or another using any technique, materials, or pattern. At least 70% of costume must be handmade by youth

Leather Creations – Use leather, suede, or faux leather to create any accessory in any style

*Make It With Wool – Sew, knit or crochet a garment from fabric or yarn of 60% (or more) wool

Softie Challenge – Sew, felt, knit, or crochet a stuffed item that is a representation of something

*Traditional - Construct any garment or outfit for yourself showcasing your sewing skills

*Quilt – Sew a quilt of any size or pattern with finished edges. Use any quilting method

* Traditional, Wool, & Quilt require membership in a Sewing project. All other categories are open to all members.

Evaluation of all categories includes:

value vs. cost, versatility, coordination, knowledge gained while creating entry, presentation, overall look, fit, cleanliness, complexity of skills used compared to sewing experience, and more! During evaluation, each participant is given 30-60 seconds to talk about their entry and then the evaluators ask guestions about the entry.


Members may enter multiple Categories; only one entry per category and an item may not be entered in multiple categories. Except costume, all garment & accessory entries are to be worn by member (not created/fitted for others)

Divisions (as of 12/31/23): Primary (5-8yrs, not scored); Junior (9-10yrs); Intermediate (11-13yrs); Senior (14-18yrs) RAME . Category entry forms due 4pm April 12, 2024

Participant entry form due 11:59pm March 29, 2024
