Gold Ridge and Sonoma RCDs have grant opportunities to support producers both technically and financially in implementing an array of conservation



These grant opportunities include the Sonoma-Marin Ag and County Climate Coalition (SMACCC) Pilot Project and the California Department of Food and Agriculture (CDFA) Healthy Soils Program Block Grant. **Applicants from socially-disadvantaged groups* and historically-underserved producers** will receive priority funding.**

Recipients will work with an RCD conservation planner for assistance in project development, implementation, and verification.

Applications will be accepted on a rolling basis. Projects can begin as early as Fall 2024.
