## 4-H Shooting Sports Leader Range Checklist

The 4-H shooting sports program in California is administered by the University of California Agriculture and Natural Resources (UCANR). This checklist is designed to assist 4-H shooting sports leaders in preparing their shooting range to insure the safety of all participants at the club, camp, or county level before any shooting takes place. (Last revision 6/2015)

1		Do you have complete and signed youth and adult medical release/emergency contact forms on hand for all participants?
2		Is there a landline telephone or a cell phone with reception on site?
3		Is there ample drinking water available?
4		Is there a stocked and accessible first aid kit?
5		Is there an area for attendance/sign-in sheets?
6		Are there restrooms and hand washing facilities available?
7		Is there controlled access to the range?
8		Is there an adequate backstop/impact area?
9		Are left and right range limits displayed?
10		Is the firing line clearly marked?
11		Is the ready line clearly marked?
12		Is there a designated spectator area?
13		Are there racks available to hold equipment not in use?
14		Are range rules posted?
15		For firearms only, is there a secure/separate container for dud ammunition?
