POLICY

Dear 4-H Volunteer Family,

I believe that each one of you is the reason that our 4-H youth have wonderful and meaningful learning opportunities. The experiences that you facilitate are no doubt contributing factors to the development of thriving youth and healthy and stable communities. Although you may not hear from me or my office as often as we should to say thank you for your work and commitment, please know that we appreciate and value your contributions very much. In recent months, several issues have arisen that have caused some pause. Specifically, there have been issues about the way you communicate with each other and respect each other in your efforts to provide 4-H members a quality educational experience. It is my hope that you remember that the focus of our programmatic efforts is the 4-H member. Their growth in our program is dependent on this consideration. I am asking each of you to search within and ask this question: is the primary reason I volunteer with 4-H to serve the 4-H member? Do you exemplify – in words actions and deeds – the model of 4-H we want our members to show. If the answers are yes, then the guide of your work should be the 4-H Code of Conduct. It should influence every 4-H conversation; every 4-H interaction; every 4-H experience.

In the coming weeks and months, I'll be reviewing our adherence to the 4-H Code of Conduct with you and where it's not being adhered to address it. Our 4-H members deserve our best effort, attitude, intention and behavior – including what we say to each other, what we say on social media about each other and our subsequent reaction at all times. It is important that we conduct and comport ourselves in the manner consistent with the values and ideals that we agree to when we enroll in the program. The standard is high – and rightfully so - because we expect the very best.

Let's uplift and support each other on behalf of the 4-H member. Let's respect each other and the value we bring to the lives of our members. Go out and continue to do good work with the 4-H member at the center. It is not about how much money we raise, the number of ribbons, stars, pins awards we earn or that the youth earn under our leadership, it's about the positive youth development experience the member has with our guidance and support. Move beyond the self and put the 4-H member first.

• Be Sure to Use To Use - Record Book Manual 2015-2016 and Forms

Record Book Manual 2015-2016 is the record manual and forms that should be used this year. It is available on the state 4-H website and on our county website. This new record book manual is divided up into three manuals: instructions, forms and further explanations. The online record book system uses the forms from this 2015-2016 manual. • 2015-2016 County Record Book ID Form & Information

Forms and information for the 2016 LA County Record Book Competition are available on the LA County 4-H website. The on-line recordkeeping will be the same as last year. For the LA County competition, the 4-H forms will need to be printed out and submitted. The 2015-2016 record books are due **Tuesday**, **September 13 to the 4-H Office by 4pm** or by **Wednesday**, **September 14 by 9pm to an Incentives and Recognition Committee member** (Noel Keller, Judylynn Pelling, Carrie DeYoung, Dee Keese and Peter Michel). The LA County Awards Program will be held Saturday, October 22th after the county 4-H Pet Symposium.

This year we will again be awarding Junior and Teen Leadership Merit Awards and Senior Awards of Excellence. This year there is an additional Senior Award of Excellence that can be awarded in the area of Project Work. • Club Representatives For County Record Book Evaluating (Judging)

State 4-H wants to use the term **"Evaluator"**, where in the past we used **"Judge"**. We are in the process of trying to update all our information with this new term.

REMINDER – If a club submits record books to the county Record Book competition, then the club needs to provide an evaluator (the new term for judge) for one of the Record Book Evaluation days, Saturday September 17 or September 24. The evaluating again this year will be held at Good Shepherd Lutheran School/Church (6338 N. Figueroa St., LA, 90042). Evaluating record books is a good way to learn about record books for your club. No experience in evaluating is required. There is an orientation for evaluating at the start of each evaluation day. This year we will be using the new state evaluation method for record books so the orientation is needed by all evaluators. A club can only have up to three club representatives for evaluating. Evaluators do not evaluate record books from their own club. Evaluators should plan to stay from 8:30am until about 5pm, with a lunch and snacks provided. • LA County 4-H Officer Book Gold Medal

Did you do a great job as a club officer last year? If so, be sure to submit a 2015-2016 Officer Book for the officer book recognition program. The information and forms for the 2016 Officer Book Recognition Program are on the county website under APPLICATIONS. The evaluation of the officer records is done with the Danish system of judging so all officers have a chance to earn a Gold medal for their officer work. 2015-2016 Officer books are due at the same time as 2015-2016 record books, September 13 to the 4-H Office or by September 14 to an Incentives and Recognition Committee member (Noel Keller, Judylynn Pelling, Carrie DeYoung, Dee Keese and Peter Michel).

• Club Program Goals

Each year clubs are encouraged to plan club goals at the start of the program year. During the year the club works on trying to reach their goals. At the end of the program year, the club evaluates how well they did in meeting their goals for that year. As of July 1, 2016, the new California 4-H Management Board system has started and the section and state 4-H Leaders' Councils have been disbanded. The state has been divided into 4 Areas. Los Angeles County 4-H is now part of the new Southern Area (7 counties – Imperial, Los Angeles, Riverside, Orange, San Bernardino, San Diego, and Ventura). Activities in the Southern Area are being planned by Event Committees under the Southern Area Program Development Committee of the Management Board. Noel Keller of Pomona Valley 4-H Club has been selected as the adult LA County representative to the Southern Area Program Development Committee and Xavier Cruz of Macy 4-H Club has been selected as the youth LA County representative.

The first meeting of the Management Board is Sunday, August 10 in Davis at the state 4-H office. John Trammell of San Bernardino County is the Southern Area Director on the Board. The first meeting of the Southern Area committee is TBD (probably in September). Plans are already moving forward on two fall Southern Area events – a Small Animal Field Day and a Healthy Living Summit.

Currently, the operation of the county, district, club and project 4-H activities will basically be the same as in the past under the new California 4-H Management Board system. Instead of LA County representatives to the South Section Council, we will now have an adult and a youth representative to the Southern Area Program Development Committee.
