Featured Speakers:

STEPHEN M. VANTASSEL

Stephen M. Vantassel is the Vertebrate Pest Specialist, Montana Department of Agriculture (https://agr.mt.gov/Vertebrate-Pests).

Stephen began working in the wildlife control industry in the early 1980s when he obtained his license as a Problem Animal Control agent. In 1994, Stephen founded Wildlife Removal Service, Inc. (sold in 1998) servicing clients in western Massachusetts. Later, he spent 10 years at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln managing the Internet Center for Wildlife Damage Management (ICWDM.org). He is a Certified Wildlife Control Professional (CWCPTM) and Associate Certified Entomologist (ACETM).

Stephen has published scores of articles and several books on wildlife control. His latest book is a revision of the classic Being Kind to Animal Pests which explains how to use cage/box traps humanely. He is presently revising Dr. Austin Frishman's book, Vertebrate Pest Handbook. Stephen is based in beautiful, Lewistown, MT, where he loves helping his fellow Montanans resolve vertebrate pest complaints.

TIMMY MADERE

Timmy Madere began his career in the pest control industry early in life, crawling in attics and under houses for his Grandfather's pest control company every summer. In 2008, Timmy went to work for the City of New Orleans Mosquito, Rodent, and Termite Control Board as a general pest control specialist and research assistant and is still working there today as their Urban Rodentologist.

Timmy has worked on research studies and urban pest issues concerning everything from termites and bedbugs to coyotes and raccoons; but his primary focus is on commensal rodents and urban rodent control.

Timmy has written articles on rodent biology and control techniques for the National Wildlife Control Operator Association (NWCOA) and PCT magazine; as well as being a featured speaker in 2015, 2016, 2017, 2018, and 2019, for PCT magazines' annual rodent control webinar. Timmy has a BA in History from the University of New Orleans.
