Requirements to become a 4-H Alameda County Ambassador:

- Achieved the 4-H rank of Gold or equivalent*
- Currently in at least your 2nd year in 4-H
- Currently 14 years old by December 31, 2020
- Ability to attend State 4-H Leadership Conference at least once during your All Star term (coming summer or the following summer)
- Applicant and legal guardian must agree to expectations
- Be prepared to serve on the Team for 18 months (May of current year through October of the following calendar year)
- Complete application

THE ALAMEDA COUNTY 4-H AMBASSADOR APPLICATION COMPONENTS

The 5 items below constitute your Alameda County 4-H Ambassador Application and must be submitted online on April 1, 2021 by 10:00 PM. Late or incomplete applications are not accepted.

- Three sources for your letters of recommendation:
 - 4-H Adult Volunteer not related to you;
 - Unrelated adult from outside of 4-H Program (examples: coach, teacher, pastor); and
 - Peer of the applicant 18 years old or younger.Submit the names and email contact information of your references with your application. Please give each of these references the following survey link to fill out:

- Essay Questions: Please complete at least a paragraph long answer for each question.
 1. What are you going to bring to the All Star/County Ambassador program?
 2. What do you expect the All Star/County Ambassador program to do for you?
- Autobiographical (or My 4-H) Story
 - Story should highlight your growth, passions and character development within your 4-H life as well as your growth in your community.
 - This should be approximately 1,000 to 1,500 words in length and double-spaced typed.
- Gold Star Rank Page or Alternate Documentation (see alternate documentation required below)
 - All documents must be recently reviewed, approved, signed and dated by Club Leader
- Resume

Gold Star Alternate Documentation

1. Mastery of a project as demonstrated by at least 6 hours of instruction, documented by a statement of skills.
2. 40 hours of significant leadership roles, either inside or outside of 4-H, with at least 10 hours of leadership contributed to 4-H.
3. 30 hours of citizenship and/or community service, either inside or outside of 4-H, with at least 6 hours through 4-H.
4. 10 public speaking engagements, at least 2 of which must have been given at a 4-H event.
5. Demonstrate involvement in 4-H as evidenced by a list of activities that are a combination of 15 of the following: project skill activities, 4-H events attended, and honors/recognition. Definitions for these three categories are found in the Record Book Manual under the section describing the Personal Development Report (PDR). Completing a PDR is not an application requirement for 4-H All Star/County Ambassador.

THE ALAMEDA COUNTY 4-H AMBASSADOR APPLICATION TIMELINE

Phase 1: Application Process (now through April 1st)

All candidates applying for the County Ambassador Team will submit the following by Wednesday, April 1, 2021, 10:00 PM:

- County ambassador online application form
- Three names, with contact info, of the individuals that will concurrently submit Letters of Recommendation for you

Phase 2: Interview Process (mid-April)

All candidates completing Phase 1 of the application process will be invited to a group session to include an individual interview:

- Group activity resulting in a collaborative presentation
- Individual interview with three evaluators
- Wrap-up session with information on the remainder of the process

Phase 3: County Ambassador Speech (end of April)

If the candidate is selected to proceed for the final selection process they will be notified of acceptance to this next phase. Prepare a speech to be presented at 4-H Leader Council on April 27, 2021 or other designated event. The topic of the speech must be on one of the following topics:

- Leadership
- Youth/Adult Partnerships
- Service Learning Projects

The speech should be under ten minutes. Remember to keep it positive.

You are encouraged to research and use the elements of public speaking to your advantage. Notecards are allowed and practice is very important to your delivery. The evaluators will be using criteria similar to those found in the Presentation Day Manual. It is not recommended that you read your speech. The use of visual aids is allowed and, although not mandatory, they can be effective for some people.

THE ALAMEDA COUNTY 4-H AMBASSADOR PROGRAM EXPECTATIONS

County 4-H Ambassador is the highest position of the County 4-H Program. County Ambassador is a “working award”. It provides the County Ambassador Team an opportunity to focus attention on leadership roles. The following are expectations from the Team:

- Participate in informational outreach within and outside of the 4-H community
- Attend monthly County Ambassador Team meetings and 4-H Leader Council meetings
- Develop educational programs and outreach at county, area, and state levels
- Participate in opportunities for social interaction and team building in all 4-H levels
- Commit to 18 month term (May 2021 to October 2022)
- Develop a County Ambassador Team “Action Plan”, with selected team advisors, for the 4-H program year of leadership consistent with program expectations. The Action Plan will then be submitted to 4-H Leader Council in August or September

Leadership Menu

Ambassador roles are presented through a variety of different activities and events. The following list is an overview of the possible opportunities an Ambassador can choose from but are not limited to.

Year-round opportunities: Leaders’ Council Officer, 4-H outreach

Highlighted activities are expected. Other activities are optional but strongly encouraged!

Alameda County Ambassador Advisor

Once the selection process is complete the candidates will be notified. The Team will begin to develop plans and, along with the Leaders' Council Executive Board, will select two advisors. One will be over 25 years of age and meet State 4-H chaperone requirements. The second will be an adult leader at least 18 years of age. No parent of a current team member is eligible to become an advisor. Advisor applicants will be screened by the Executive Board of Leaders' Council. In cases when there are less than four County Ambassadors, one advisor may be acceptable if another adult is present at all meetings, events and activities. Advisors serve for one 18-month term, but may be reappointed by the incoming team. The final selection of the advisors will be made by the incoming team.
