### **Evaluation Approach**

- After every webinar assessed:
- Change in awareness
   of topics covered
- New knowledge gained
- New skills gained
- Changes to opinions or attitudes; and
- Confidence in their capacity to change the food system

At final event asked:

- Change in knowledge
   of specific topics
- Capacity to change food system; and
- Open-ended questions
  - How they have used information
  - How they will use information
  - Interest in future
     opportunities

### **Evaluation Results**

**Reach:** 292 webinar participants; 48 people attended the in-person gathering, representing 35 organizations

#### Increased knowledge:

- Equitable food systems (81%);
- The historical roots of inequity in land access and housing in Silicon Valley (81%);
- Diverse cultural food traditions (80%); and
- Strategies for promoting equity and community-led solutions (82%).

98% of respondents indicated they would take action – or had already taken action – as a result of the series, including:

- Increased networking and collaboration;
- Implementing values-based procurement;
- Sharing learnings with others, including program participants and colleagues; and
- Advocating for systems-level change.



### The Food and Food Processing

#### **Innovation Program**

- Focuses on creating value-added products from locally grown and climate-adaptable crops.
- Develops market-ready offerings, monitors trends, and innovates in processing equipment
- Aims to expand local and global markets for enhanced food landscape

#### Local Food Hub Program

- Aggregates, distributes, and markets source-identified products to diverse consumer markets
- Strengthens regional economies by creating a centralized distribution point, fostering trade among local farmers and producers

#### Food to Share Hub

- Expands food recovery, storage, and distribution capacity in Fresno/Clovis metropolitan area
- Includes a commercial kitchen and space for cooking training



#### **Community Kitchen Facility**

- Provides a vibrant shared space with a state-of-the-art kitchen for mobile food vendors.
- Offers on-site business support, fostering a collaborative environment for culinary innovation


#### Food Entrepreneurship Academy

- Provides comprehensive technical assistance in business planning, marketing, finance, and food safety
- Equips entrepreneurs to establish and grow successful food businesses

### F3 Local – The Program - Farm

#### **Equipment Lending Program**

- Dedicated resource hub for agricultural tools and equipment.
- Supports small-scale farmers who lack means for equipment purchase and maintenance.

#### Farm Innovation Program

- Serves as a conduit for communicating farming community needs to the broader research and development ecosystem, driving transformative solutions in agriculture
- Drives progress in agricultural technology and sustainable farming practices.

#### VINE

- Commercialization support to agtech startups
- Connections to demonstration, investment and industry connections



#### Small Farm Technology Innovation Alliance

- Network involving project partners, community-based organizations, small- to medium-scale family farmers, and ag-tech companies
- Works with researchers and industry to address challenges in food production, processing, and regulations.
- Aims to reduce barriers for small-scale farmers and food businesses to enter new markets

#### Farm to Market Support

- Offers tools, marketing materials, and resources tailored to expand market reach and grow businesses
- Provides technical and marketing support for farmers and guidance for institutions to incorporate locally sourced ingredients
