<i>Aloysia triphylla</i> Lemon Verbena	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ To 5-6' tall, larger with age. ▪ Elegant open, airy form. ▪ Prune to keep from becoming too leggy. ▪ Medium green tri-lobed leaves are strongly lemon scented (mmmmmm...) and popular for teas, iced drinks, jellies, and potpourri. ▪ Branch tips bear small pale lavender summer flowers in open clusters. ▪ Protect from heavy frost. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ USDA Zones 8a to 10b ▪ Full sun to part shade ▪ Shrub, Evergreen frost sensitive ▪ Low water (WUCOLS)
<i>Alyogyne</i> cv. Blue Hibiscus	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ To 8' tall and wide. ▪ A hybrid between <i>Alyogyne huegelii</i> and <i>A. hakeifolia</i>, two related species from Australia. ▪ Long bloom season with large hibiscus-like mauve flowers. ▪ Fast-growing and may suffer from wind damage. ▪ Well-drained soils are preferable. ▪ Prune to shape. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ USDA Zones 9a to 10b ▪ Part shade ▪ Shrub, Evergreen ▪ Low water (WUCOLS)

<p><i>Buddleia lindleyana</i></p> <hr/> <p>Weeping Butterfly Bush</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ To 6' tall. ▪ Far less known than the typical Butterfly Bush. ▪ Bright green foliage on arching stems. ▪ Blooms late spring to late summer, producing long, pendulous flower trusses. ▪ Flowers emerge royal purple from lavender buds. ▪ Flowering spikes elongate as blooming continues and can reach 2' long. ▪ Heat tolerant, long blooming, and a great habitat plant that attracts hummingbirds, butterflies and bees. ▪ Prune anytime to control form and size. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ USDA Zones 5b to 9b ▪ Full sun ▪ Shrub, Deciduous ▪ Low water (WUCOLS)
<p><i>Centaurea gymnocarpa</i></p> <hr/> <p>Velvet Centaurea</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ To 3-4' tall and as much as 8' wide. ▪ Sprawling with long, somewhat lax stems. ▪ Stems and deeply dissected feathery foliage covered with dense felted hairs, giving a silvery-white appearance. ▪ Blooms most of spring with big, purple pincushion-like flowers. ▪ Tolerates clay, some shade, drought. ▪ Deer resistant. ▪ Great choice for hillsides or otherwise neglected areas. ▪ Prune hard as needed to avoid a rangy appearance. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ▪ USDA Zones 8b to 11 ▪ Full sun to part shade ▪ Perennial, Evergreen ▪ Low water (WUCOLS)
