California 4-H

The California 4-H Scholarships for Higher Education program awards participants in the 4-H Youth Development Program financial assistance for continuing their education. The annual deadline is April, though the available scholarships vary each year.

California Farm Bureau Federation

The CFBF provides 30 scholarships between \$1,500 and \$3,000 to undergraduate students entering or attending a four-year accredited college or university in California and pursuing a career in the agricultural industry. CFBF also awards a few special scholarships, including the Rustici Livestock and Rangeland Scholarship, which may be applied to either a two or four year California college.
