POLICY

4-H Policy and Information Update April, 2013

The 4-H program affords many opportunities for young people to engage in meaningful experiences that lead to healthy and thriving adults. 4-H Members are supported by volunteers who share a deep commitment to them and support their ongoing work. One way volunteers support youth is by providing resources and material to help facilitate the learning process. Resources are secured, by and large, through fundraisers. In order to be sure that fundraisers are conducted in compliance with University of California 4-H policy, I have outlined a few things to keep in mind:

1. ALL fundraisers need to be approved by the 4-H County Office. No club, unit, council or individual is allowed to conduct a fundraiser using the 4-H name or emblem without prior approval from this office (see <http://ucanr.org/sites/UC4-H/Administration/Policies/Chapter9/> for information on how to obtain approval)
2. ALL fundraisers must have a youth development purpose associated with it. No club, unit, council or individual should raise money without an expressed purpose or goal. Fundraisers should not be for general club support unless that support is directly related to the club's (unit's) activity
3. ALL funds raised in the name of the 4-H program are the assets (property) of the University of California and therefore subject federal, state and University of California general fund development guidelines
4. Expenditure of the funds must be consistent with the intent with which the funds were raised. Monies should not be rolled over from year-to-year and accumulated unless there is some specific long-term goal for the use of the funds.
5. Funds are to support the educational goals of youth in the program, including supporting youth to attend events, programs and conferences that reinforce the learning outcomes associated with a project or experience

- **Livestock Symposium Attracts 4-H Crowd at Fairgrounds**

"Never feed your dog toothpaste!" This is one of many facts 4-H member Sasha Ridenour of Agua Dulce learned at the 4-H Livestock Symposium on Saturday, January 26, 2013. Many 4-H members and parents from the Antelope Valley area attended the annual event at the AV Fairgrounds to become more knowledgeable about their animals.

Livestock Symposium Coordinator Charlene Moore of Palmdale says that the event benefits both kids and adults when they have a chance to interact with professionals from various organizations who are brought in as speakers and vendors. "It helps keep our youth and leaders up to date with their livestock information."

This year the event offered sessions on raising beef, showing sheep, grooming swine, horseshoeing, dog nutrition, rabbit breeds, poultry hatching, training goats, and much more.

Experienced session speaker Nicole Smith traveled from Bakersfield and presented a seminar called "Market Goat Selection and Raising." After being in 4-H for 10 years, holding every officer position in her club, and earning many Grand Champion awards, Ms. Smith had plenty of good advice. "I enjoy teaching goat showmanship. That's my specialty, you could say. I think you can never go to enough seminars," she commented as she stood by the two goats she used for demonstration.

Canyon Coyotes parent Amy Karle attended the Livestock Symposium with her daughter, Ashley. Mrs. Karle said, "The most important thing in showmanship is to keep your eyes on the judge." Mrs. Karle and Ashley attended multiple sessions including "Dairy Goat Q&A", "Sheep Evaluation and Nutrition", and "Ethics".

Ravina White from Acton added, "The goat demonstration was pretty fun."

The Canyon Coyotes managed a food booth which gave youth a chance to serve the crowd and raise money for the club. Kenny Granger of Agua Dulce said, "Today I enjoyed working the soda booth. It's really fun helping people."

Armed with a fuller understanding of their animals and the expectations of the fair judges, the Antelope Valley 4-H members will have a few months of work ahead of them to put all the presenters' suggestions into action. Make plans now to attend the Antelope Valley Fair auction when quality ranch-raised animals will be sold to local buyers.

- **PVP 4H Rocketry makes National Finals in the Team America Rocketry Challenge**

“TARC 2013 started with a challenge: build a rocket that can hit a precise altitude of 750 feet, has a total flight time of 48-50 seconds, and recovers a raw egg safely with a 15 inch parachute. A record setting 725 teams from Spain to California accepted the challenge. Thousands of launches and a few broken eggs later we have arrived at our National Finalist”

Our Palos Verdes Peninsula 4H Rocketry TARC Team qualified for the Team America Rocketry Challenge (TARC). TARC is the world’s largest rocketry contest. Our score of 13.5 made the qualifying cut off of 16.12 (the score closest to zero is best). We made it in the top 100 teams out of 750 that will be going to the finals in Virginia on May 11th. We will be having breakfast hosted by a U.S. Senator, meet aerospace engineers and have a great time. We’ll let you know how it goes next month.

Dear 4-H Families, and Volunteers,

The economic climate has continued to sustain fiscal challenges facing 4-H programmatic support. Last year we shared that UC Cooperative Extension and 4-H at the state level is no longer able to absorb all costs and that fee increases were necessary to support our local programming. The 2013-2014 program fees are \$12.00 per adult and \$34.00 per youth.

These program fees will be used to provide partial funding for direct local program support including critical 4-H staff that supports our local programs.

We continue to encourage everyone to strategize together around the development of a local funding plan to keep 4-H strong and growing. The California 4-H Foundation is a valuable resource with whom to partner in developing such a plan.

Many counties have been successful in developing and moving forward with local funding plans. They have worked to provide program fee scholarships, partial and full fee waivers and provide other support.
