4-H Policy and Information Update June, 2013

The 4-H San Gabriel Valley Fair has been a historical legacy and treasure of the program for decades. Throughout the years, 4-H members have experienced the wonders and fulfillment of positive youth development through the fair. In order to continue providing 4-H members with a quality experience during the fair and to grow the level of participation, I am asking the 4-H leaders and members who are responsible for planning and coordinating the fair to do the following:

- To refocus our efforts on positive youth development
- To create a healthy environment for 4-H members and leaders
- To begin to establish a Thriving vision for the fair
- To lay a pathway for the way forward vis-a-vis the fair

Specifically, I am asking for:

- A Vision Statement for the Fair
- A mission statement for the fair
- Purpose statement for 2014 fair
- Written plan for 2014 fair
- Educational goals and objectives for 2014
- A clearly articulated youth & adult partnership plan
- A leadership structure consistent with YAP and a Thriving framework for 2014 (using iThrive/iChampion)
- Creating a space for safety for youth and adults
- Provide a fair budget that shows expected revenue and expenses
- Minutes of each meeting
- Due to the county office by September 30, 2013

Over the next few months, I will provide more guidance and direction to those volunteers and youth planning to be involved with the fair. I will work with the fair planning team to help them include language and intention that is consistent with having a fair based on positive youth development, that can grow and can be sustainable for years to come.



• PVP 4H Rocketry Placed 25th in Team America Rocketry Challenge (TARC) Wesley Rich, PVP 4H Club

On May 9th our rocketry project's TARC team headed to Virginia for a weekend of events at the national finals and to compete as one of the 100 finalists (out of 750!). On Friday, we headed to Washington DC to the Russell Senate building for Rockets on the Hill, a breakfast event hosted by a US Senator. We met with other teams, aerospace companies and STEM educators. We presented our rocket at the table with the other 10 California teams. On May 11th, we went to the finals at Great Meadows in The Plains, Virginia. We had a successful launch of our rocket and came in 25th out of the 100 teams. Teams 1-24th were given a 2nd launch that figured out the top winners. Teams 25th -29th were given a second launch for the spectators and when we calculated our second score, we would have come in 6th place if we had been in the top 24!!! Our team had the best score out of the entire west coast. The winning team was a 4H group from Texas! While we were in Washington DC, we got to visit the National Air and Space Museum which has a space shuttle viewing. We had a great time and are already planning our 2014 TARC rocket!

• 2012-2013 County Record Book Competition and Awards Day

The 2012-2013 4-H program year will end on June 30, so you just have one more month to complete your 4-H activities for this year. Have you done all that you had hoped to complete? If not, you still have a little more time.

The county record book competition will be run much like last year, but there is now a new California 4-H Record Book Manual - 2011-2013. Seniors should plan to submit their records on the forms in the new Manual. Due to the lateness of the release of the new record book manual, Juniors and Intermediates will be allowed to use the 2011 record book manual, but should expect to use the new manual next year. Your 2012-2013 Record Book should contains your 4-H records from July 1, 2012 to June 30, 2013.

The online 4-H recordkeeping uses the new forms and will be handled the same as last year. For the county competition the online 4-H forms will need to be printed out and submitted as hard copy.

The 2013 Record Book ID form and guidelines are now available on the county website under Applications. Notice that the record book title page, table of contents, and Expression Page for a Annual Project Report are no longer optional. Contact a member on the county I&R Committee if you have any questions.

The LA County Awards Program will be held Saturday, October 12th after the county Pet Symposium.

Do You Have a LA County Officer Book Gold Medal?

If not, why not? All club officers (Juniors and above) are eligible to earn a Officer Book gold medal for their officer work during the year if they submit an Officer Book for the officer book program. The forms and information for the 2013 Officer Book Recognition program are now on the county website under Applications. The program will be much the same as last year. All club officers are encouraged to prepare their officer records for award consideration after the end of the program year (June 30). Officers are encouraged to make their office the best it can be and try for a Gold medal. The evaluation of the officer records is done with the Danish system of judging so all officers have a chance to earn a Gold medal for their officer work. Officer books are due by September 10 to the 4-H office or by September 11 to an I&R Committee member.
