# **GARDENING TIPS**

#### October

In the San Francisco Bay Area Peninsula, this is the time to feed hydrangeas with acidifier for bluer blooms or feed with agricultural lime to turn them pink, plant bulbs for spring blooms, plant natives, plant garlic and shallots for a summer harvest, prepare planting beds for winter, clear out weeds and rocks, add soil amendments and/or plant winter cover crops such as fava beans to replace nitrogen in the soil, add fallen leaves and plant debris to your compost pile or leave them on the ground to serve as a natural mulch for your garden.
