Members have an opportunity to model the garments they have made or purchased and to present themselves at their best in personal grooming, posture, modeling, and accessorizing their garment. The day is one of learning, as well as competing. Instruction will be given, especially to the Beginners, on how to model. All entrants will receive written, constructive comments on their outfits. Members must be enrolled in the clothing or fashion revue projects.
