# Policy

## 4-H Policy and Information Update

I believe that each one of you is the reason that our 4-H youth have wonderful and meaningful learning opportunities. The experiences that you facilitate are no doubt contributing factors to the development of thriving youth and healthy and stable communities. Although you may not hear from me or my office as often as we should to say thank you for your work and commitment, please know that we appreciate and value your contributions very much. In recent months, several issues have arisen that have caused some pause. Specifically, there have been issues about the way you communicate with each other and respect each other in your efforts to provide 4-H members a quality educational experience. It is my hope that you remember that the focus of our programmatic efforts is the 4-H member. Their growth in our program is dependent on this consideration. I am asking each of you to search within and ask this question: is the primary reason I volunteer with 4-H to serve the 4-H member? Do you exemplify – in words actions and deeds – the model of 4-H we want our members to show. If the answers are yes, then the guide of your work should be the 4-H Code of Conduct. It should influence every 4-H conversation; every 4-H decision; every 4-H interaction; every 4-H experience.

In the coming weeks and months, I'll be reviewing our adherence to the 4-H Code of Conduct with you and where it's not being adhered to address it. Our 4-H members deserve our best effort, attitude, intention and behavior – including what we say to each other, what we say on social media about each other and our subsequent reaction at all times. It is important that we conduct and comport ourselves in the manner consistent with the values and ideals that we agree to when we enroll in the program. The standard is high – and rightfully so - because we expect the very best.

Let's uplift and support each other on behalf of the 4-H member. Let's respect each other and the value we bring to the lives of our members. Go out and continue to do good work with the 4-H member at the center. It is not about how much money we raise, the number of ribbons, stars, pins awards we earn or that the youth earn under our leadership, it's about the positive youth development experience the member has with our guidance and support. Move beyond the self and put the 4-H member first.

Start your club year by setting some club goals – a new project, more members, more community service, etc. Clubs are encouraged to set club goals at the beginning of the 4-H year and work during the year to reach those goals. This is a county program to encourage clubs to make club goals and evaluate how they met those goals at the end of the program year. Clubs submit their club goals by November 1 and report the completed club goals by August 15. Clubs can receive a seal for their charter based on how well they met the goals for the year. The county I&R Committee will be considering some additional incentives for clubs to plan goals for the year. Officer books are due to the 4-H office by 4pm, September 12 or by Wednesday, September 13 by 9pm to an Incentives & Recognition Committee member.

**REMINDER** – If a member submits a record book to the County Record Book Competition, then the club needs to provide an evaluator (the current term for judge) for one of the Record Book Evaluation days, Saturday September 16 or September 23. The evaluating again this year will be held at Good Shepherd Lutheran School/Church (6338 N. Figueroa St., LA, 90042). Evaluating record books is a good way to learn about record books for your club. No experience in evaluating is required. There is an orientation for evaluating at the start of each evaluation day. This year we will again be using the new state evaluation method for record books so the orientation is needed by all evaluators. A club can only have up to three club representatives for evaluating. Evaluators do not evaluate record books from their own club. Evaluators should plan to stay from 8:30am until about 5pm, with a lunch and snacks provided.
