GARDEN EDUCATION CENTER UPDATE



The Garden Education Center (GEC) at the San Mateo Event Center is now a UC Master Gardener experiment for Bermuda grass eradication and soil structure improvement. The soil at the GEC is compacted with little diversity of microbial life which is a perfect situation for weedy plants, including Bermuda grass. To overcome this problem, a diversity of cool season cover crops were chosen to grow over winter: fava beans, crimson clover, berseem clover, Austrian winter peas, common vetch, lupine, daikon radish and phacelia. The cover crops were chosen from

the <u>California Cover Crop Chart</u> prepared by the Natural Resources Conservation Services (NRCS). These plants will add carbon to feed the soil life, help winter rain move deeper into the soil, outcompete the weeds, break up compaction, support and increase microbial life, and develop worm populations. Prior to sow ing the seeds, the GEC land was cleared of mulch, visible Bermuda grass, and graded. The seeds were planted in October 2018, a compost extract was sprinkled over the seeds, and then the seeds were covered with compost. Within days the seeds started germinating and the GEC is now a blanket of green. While the GEC is not currently open to the public, you are welcome to come by and take a look. The Garden Education Center is next to the parking lot for the Jockey Club, enter from So. Delaw are Street gate in San Mateo as the GEC borders Saratoga Drive. Stay tuned as our experiment continues.
