APHID CONTROL

Aphids are one of the most common garden pests, infesting and weakening our crops while spreading plant diseases. As a gardener you have the power to fight back using organic, nature-friendly techniques to banish aphids from your garden. SUM MER PRUNING

Summer pruning maintains a tree's shape and size (keeps them small), encourages fruit on low er branches, allow s more sunlight and air circulation into a tree to ripen and color up fruit, prevents branches loaded with fruit from snapping, prevents diseases and pests, and controls fungal problems in apricot and cherry trees. Through presentation, demonstrations and audience discussion, participants will examine succulents in nature and in cultivation, explore the science of growing succulents including planting location, soil mixes and amendments, water, light, repotting and propagation, diseases and pests, and horticultural forms and oddities. You will be encouraged to use sustainable gardening practices, analyze the characteristics of some of the more common succulent genera including Sedum, Euphorbia, Aeonium, Echeveria, Cotyledon, Crassula, Kalanchoe, Agave, Haw orthia and Aloe, provide examples of garden design, container gardening and creative ways to display succulents. You will learn to sequence your planting schedule and choose winter edibles. We will "crack" and plant certified seed garlic, learn how to grow potatoes in pots, and discuss details of growing onions. A handson exercise will teach you how to make and use low tunnels for season extension. Guests will take home an edible seedling ready for their home garden, grown by UC Master Gardeners.
