BIOREACTOR PROJECT

Master Gardeners and friends helped fill the <u>Johnson-Su</u>
<u>Compost Bioreactor</u> on Saturday, July 20, 2019, at the San
Mateo Gardenling Education Center (GEC). A small group of
helpers built the cage lined with landscape fabric, and set it on a
w ood pallet with scaffolding on all sides. Materials to fill the
bioreactor were gathered by many Master Gardeners. A hedge at

the GEC was trimmed, chipped, and dried. It took two hours to actually fill the four foot wide by five foot tall cage, and a few more hours of shade setup, discussion, breaks and clean up. In black cement mixing trays, they hydrated or inoculated the fill materials in a compost extract bath that was mixed over and over again until a total of three yards of hedge chips, goat bedding, and oak leaves were soaked and drained. Five gallon buckets were used to fill up the bioreactor. Six four-inch PVC perforated drain pipes were placed into the contents one foot apart for air circulation. Twenty-four hours later the bioreactor reached 110°F. They removed the pipes and frame holding the pipes, added drip irrigation, and covered the top. The air holes were holding up well just as described by Dr. David Johnson who, along with his wife, created the Johnson-Su Bioreactor. Forty-eight hours later, the bioreactor registered 134°F. No turning is required as the perforations in the PVC drain pipes, inserted strategically into the mix, will provide enough air to maintain aerobic conditions. They will now wait 12 months for a highly fungal compost to finish.
