I&R** <u>County Incentive and Recognition Committee Report</u> by Noel Keller, County I&R Committee Chair <u>nkeller91711@gmail.com</u>, 909-621-2373 home,909-957-6498 cell<u>2023 County Awards event -</u> The 2023 County Awards program was held on Zoom after the September County Council meeting on Saturday, Sept. 23. LA County 4-H Ambassador Maddy Lockmann MC'ed the program. The program went well.

2023 4-H Graduates 2023 4-H Graduate pins and certificates were given out at district Achievement events in the fall. A 4-H graduate who was in 4-H for at least three years is eligible to receive an engraved 4-H graduate pin. Please contact Charlene Moore if one of your 2023 4-H graduates did not receive an engraved pin.

2024-2025 LA County 4-H Ambassador applications are due by Friday, Feb. 16, 2024 to Ambassador Advisor Amy Lockmann. LA County 4-H Ambassador is the highest county honor for a member. Experienced, accomplished senior members should be encouraged to apply for this working honor. It is an opportunity to expand their leadership skills and experiences. Once you are a LA County 4-H Ambassador, you are always a LA County 4-H Ambassador. A county 4-H Ambassador continues as a county 4-H Ambassador as long as they are enrolled as a 4-H member. It is the new county Ambassadors each year who take the lead for the Ambassador team that year. There is no term limit.

Spark Achievement Program As I have been mentioning this year, change has come to the 4-H star rank achievement program and record book program. The State 4-H announced the new Spark Achievement Program last Fall, with its three phases – Spark Achievement, Emerald Star I and II, and Impact Stars – Bronze, Silver, Gold and Platinum. Using the new Spark Achievement Program last year was optional, but the State is making it mandatory this year for Junior members, new 4-H members and returning members who have never completed a 4-H record book. The new Spark Achievement Manual and recording forms are now on the State 4-H website, and on the county website. You can now to go to these sources if you want more information now about what is happening.

We will be offering an informational, training question-and-answer session via zoom on the Spark Achievement Program on **Feb. 22 7-8pm** and again on **Feb. 28 7-8pm**. Watch for more information to come out about this session.

To help differentiate the two achievement programs will be calling the Bronze/Silver/Gold/Platinum program the STAR RANK program and the new program will be called the SPARK ACHIEVEMENT program.

So, how does this change affect us now? There does not need to be a change in record keeping this year for Primary members. Junior members should all be doing the Spark Achievement program. New members (all ages) should be doing the Spark Achievement program. Those members who have never done a record book should do the Spark Achievement program. Intermediates and Senior members who have earned their Bronze Star and are working on their Silver/Gold/Platinum star rank can continue in that program or start the Spark Achievement program.

The Spark Achievement program has specific goals for members to achievement in learning about 4-H and their individual spark areas. Clubs will want to offer opportunities during the year for their members to achieve these goals, so look at the Sparks, Emerald Star and Impact Star Achievements Program Manual to learn about these goals.

At this time, we expect that the County Record Book Competition will be run much like last year. Encourage your members to keep their records up-to-date during the year and not wait until summer to start their records.

Record Books for 2023-24 Information about 2023-24 record books is now on the county 4-H website. There two different Record Book ID packets — one for the Star Rank program and one for the Spark Achievement program. Be careful to use the correct ID packet and read it carefully. Note which sections are optional, but if you want your records to show all your 4-H achievements you might want to include the optional sections.

If members will be continuing the Bronze/Silver/Gold/Platinum program, their record books will be much the same as last year.

If members will be doing the new Spark Achievement program, their record book will a little different and include the Spark Achievement Report form. For this year, we require that for this new program, only written My Story sections will be accepted, not the other media options mentioned in the Spark Achievement Program manual.

4-H Record Books are optional in the 4-H program. Record Books are considered separate from 4-H achievement in the Spark Achievement Program. You can earn Spark level of achievement without during a record book, but the Spark Achievement Report Form must be completed to earn the Spark levels of achievement.

For some fairs, however, keeping 4-H records is required for entry of livestock. 4-H records can be kept, without entering them in the County Record Competition at the end of the 4-H program year.

<u>County Record Book Evaluation to be done in August</u> The I&R Committee is recommending that the County Record Book Evaluation be moved from early September to late August, with the following dates:

2023-24 Record Books due – Aug. 20 by 4pm to 4H Office & Aug. 21 by 9pm to I&R Committee

Record Book "sorting" – Aug. 22, 2024 Record Book judging – Aug. 24, 2024 County Awards event – via Zoom after the county council meeting on Sept. 7 (which is moved from Sept. 21)

Junior/Teen Leader Merit Award - Reminder - If a member wants to apply for a Junior or Teen Leader Merit Award, they need to be in Leadership project during the 4-H program year to be eligible for the award. All clubs should consider offering a Leadership project. Also, the member needs to complete a Leadership Development Report (LDR) to be considered for the award. The Star Rank system and the Spark Achievement system have different LDR forms.

Emerald Star Program The State has mandated that the current Emerald Star program ends on June 30, 2024. All Emerald Star projects must be completed by June 30th and not carried over into the next 4-H program year. Emerald Star projects may still be started this year, but need to be completed by June 30.

The second phase of the new 4-H Achievement system is called Emerald Star, which has two parts called Emerald Star I and II. That new Emerald Star

phase is not the same as the current Emerald Star program. We like what the current Emerald Star program offers our 4-H members, so the I&R Committee is considering the creation of a county level version of the current Emerald Star program, which would be available with a new name in the next 4-H program year, starting July 2024.

Friends of 4-H Each program year the County Council considers honoring an individual and/or organization that have been particularly helpful to the LA County 4-H program. Each district is encouraged to submit Friend of 4-H nominations to the County council at its next council meeting in April. Up to five such awards can be made for a year by the county council. The awards are presented at a special occasion arranged by the district nominating the recipient. Friend of 4-H nomination forms are available on the county website and should be submitted to the council Vice-President Amy Lockmann by April 5.

Reminder – The county is not planning a county-level Leader Appreciation event again this year. Districts are encouraged to plan their own Leader Appreciation event. If any of your leaders are due a special leader pin (for years 1, 5, 10, 15, etc.), contact the county office at least a month before you need the pins for your event.

iSprout Program for Primary Members Our current Primary record keeping and star rank program does not lead well into the new Spark Achievement Program. It was created to lead into the Bronze/Silver/Gold Platinum star program. Now that we are moving to the Spark Achievement Program, we need to change the LA County Primary achievement program. We are recommending that the Primary members be allowed to complete their White and/or White star pin ranks in this 23-24 4-H program year, or optionally start working on the iSprout program this year. Next year (24-25) all Primaries should be doing the iSprout program.

<u>District Representation on the County I&R Committee</u> All districts should have two elected representatives on the county Incentives and Recognition Committee. The term for a representative is one year. The current 2023-2024 county I&R Committee members are Noel Keller and Judylynn Pelling from NSG, Dee Keese and Rick Herbert from SSG, Annette Hillman and Alexis Joyner from AV, and Amy Lockmann and Nicole Darway from SFV. The committee usually

meets by conference call during the year. The next meeting is Tuesday, Feb. 27 at 7:00pm by conference call.
