

The Shasta County Cloverbuds meet on the 3rd Sunday of most months, beginning in October, 2:00—3:30pm at the 4-H Office.










### **Shasta District Fair Livestock Participation**

### 2025 Valley Shasta County Project Participation Larry Forero, Livestock Farm Advisor

Now that the details associated with the 2025 Shasta District Fair are wrapping up, I started to reflect on the number of youth that participated in the fair through the market animal program as compared to the number of youth enrolled locally in 4-H. In 2025, 513 youth exhibited and sold livestock at Shasta District Fair. The total number of youth selling at this fair is similar to last year. Figure A outlines the total number of lots sold at the fair by species since 2011.

### **Shasta District Fair Livestock Participation**

Youth can participate in this program as 4-H, FFA, Grange or Independent exhibitors. Figure B outlines the number of lots marketed by 4-H, FFA and Independent exhibitors locally. At the 2025 fair there were two hogs and one goat sold by Grange Exhibitors. Because of their small number, they're not included in the graph below.




Figure B. Number of Lots sold by Youth Organization (4-H, FFA and Independent).

It is interesting to look at the importance of market animal projects and the contribution to enrollment. In the 2024/25 program year there were 600 youth participating in Shasta County 4-H. Of these 58 were primary members (recall they cannot participate in market animal projects) and 142 youth participated in the Intermountain area. This leaves 400 youth eligible to participate in market animal projects. At the 2025 Shasta District Fair, 316 beef, swine, lamb, rabbits, and goats were sold by 4-H youth. This equates to 79% participating in market animal projects (after rabbits and sifted animals are considered, this percentage is slightly higher. The 21% who do not participate in market animal projects participate in projects ranging from archery to floral design.

4-H provides hands on learning experiences for youth in many disciplines across Shasta County, as it has for over 100 years.

# Shasta Market Match

**Double your EBT food dollars** with the Shasta Market Match at any farmers market April through December 2025.

### **Step 1: Use Your EBT Card**

Visit the Market Manager's booth at the farmers market and purchase the Shasta Market Match vouchers.

### **Step 2: Receive Shasta Market Match Vouchers**

You can receive an equal amount, up to \$15, of Shasta Market Match vouchers. Limit one visit per day.

### **Step 3: Purchase Local Produce**

Spend vouchers with vendors at the market to purchase fresh produce

When you swipe your EBT card and use your CalFresh (formerly Food Stamps) benefits to buy food at a farmer's market, the amount of money you spend (up to \$15) is matched with Shasta Market Match vouchers. The vouchers can be exchanged for locally grown fruits and vegetables. The Shasta Market Match program runs at all Shasta Grower Association certified markets. Vouchers are not redeemable for cash.
