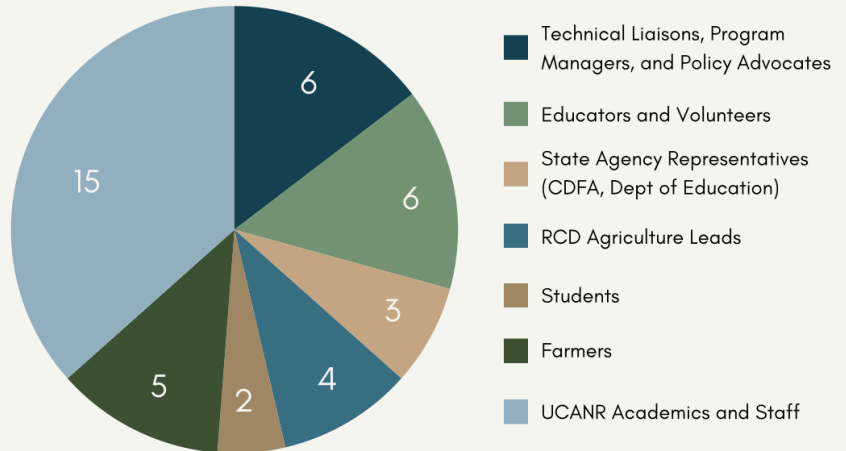


# GROWING CONNECTIONS IN ORANGE COUNTY

## KEY HIGHLIGHTS

- Rich agricultural heritage amidst a quickly growing urban area.
- Local foods benefit the community, economy, and environment.
- Top crops: nursery stock, strawberries, avocados, and bell peppers.
- Sustainability matters: drip irrigation, soil practices, and pest management practices help to strengthen yields.

## CHALLENGES

- Land ownership in OC has been prohibitive since the 1970s due to high costs of land, resources, and production.
- Many farmers rely on land access from larger landowners, educational institutions, and/or military bases depending on location.
- Land tenure leases span up to 5 years but do not provide enough long-term stability.
- Production is directly impacted by land tenure, labor support, and climate.

## RECOMMENDATIONS

- **Leverage programs:** Incentivize land match and succession programs statewide (i.e. offer an open & no-cost platform for landholders and land seekers)
- **Improve equitable access:** Provide financial aid to land seekers for down payment and land purchase
- **Establish tax credits:** Incentivize longer lease agreements (i.e. >5 years) with an option to buy or renew leases
- **Make public lands available:** guide local governments and agencies to make natural lands available to growers.
